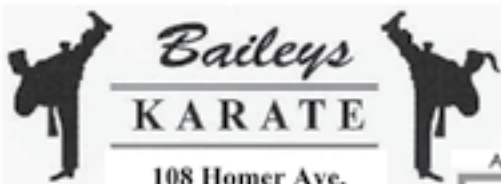

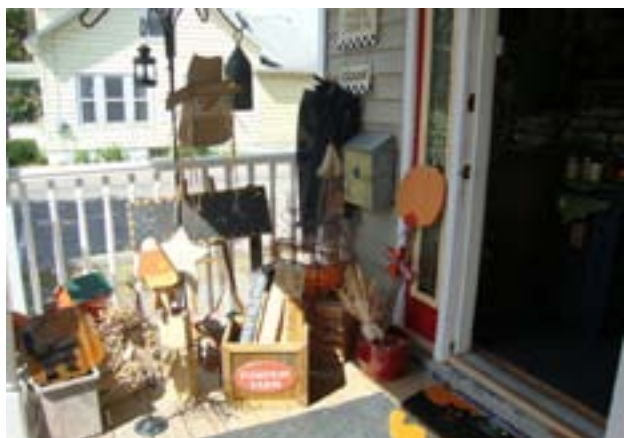

JOHN ROGERS, SCULPTOR

AT THE HEIGHT OF JOHN Rogers' popularity (1860's to 1870's) he was well renowned, and his statuary could be found in the homes of both the rich and the middle class. Even Abraham Lincoln owned a Rogers. He was considered an artist of the common man, much as Norman Rockwell was during the 20th Century. He produced from 1859 until 1892.

His figurines were known as "groups" as they usually featured more than one figure. His sculptures were cast in molds and mass produced in cast plaster. This was a departure from sculptures made of bronze or marble, and made them very affordable, averaging about \$14.00. The plaster figures were painted in a putty color.

Rogers produced over 80 groups. His most popular pieces were those depicting scenes from the Civil War, and scenes from everyday life. The pieces ranged from 8 inches up to 46 inches tall. A Rogers group is signed on the base, "John Rogers, New York, New York" and included a copyright date. The title of the piece was also on the base. The one picturing is titled, "Weighing the Baby."

Today, John Rogers groups sell from a few hundred dollars to over \$1,000, on average. John Rogers' studio at the New Canaan Historical Society, New Canaan, Connecticut is a designated US National Historical landmark.

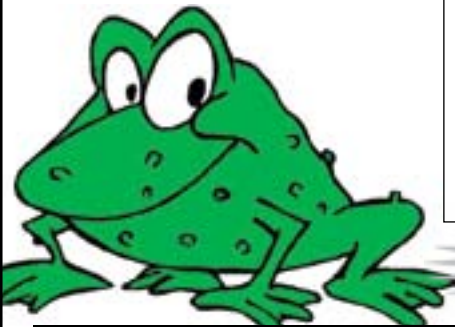

REVERSE GEAR

DOES ANYONE ELSE FIND THAT they are more nostalgic in the fall than in other times of the year? Perhaps it is because fall is a natural seasonal segue into the holidays; the time of year which I am certain elicits the most nostalgia. Perhaps in central NY, the nostalgia is due in part to the change of colors and knowing snow and ice follows in its footsteps. Jack London once said, "Darn the wheel of the world! Why must it continually turn over? Where is the reverse gear?"

Understanding his sentiments, I believe I've found the "reverse gear."

Every time I walk through the door at our shop, The Second Knob Gifts & Antiques, and especially down the stairs into my father's "antique section," I find an area where some of the wheel of the world is in reverse. Even for a... ahem... youngster like myself, our antiques bring back memories of time spent with my grandparents and elderly acquaintances -- my "reverse gear."

There's also a nice variety of glass...including cut, art, depression and carnival. A mixed selection of stoneware jugs and crocks, most of which have cobalt blue designs, will certainly catch your eye! Vintage Adirondack pack baskets, snow shoes, early hunting/fishing/trapping pin back licenses, fishing nets, wooden fishing lures, decoys, old reels, primitive wooden long bows and arrows are the favorite of many a man who visits our store. And where in the world did my dad find those early 1900's chauffeur badges? Among my favorite items are the old advertising, including paper, cardboard, plastic, glass and tin. Today's advertising graphics cannot compare to the time and effort that is evident in old advertising, back when they didn't have computer software for design and digital enhancement.

Some of the usual Collector's favorites in our store include vintage Coca-Cola and Pepsi items, military related pieces from WWI and after, Scouting memorabilia, old Enamelware and Kitchenware, and decoys, decoys, decoys. MIKE'S FISH TANK ANIMAL FACTS

Here are some neat non fish facts:

Lop bunnies generally seem to litter box train fairly easy, more so than other breeds.

For the most part a mixed breed animal tends to be friendlier than a purebred. For example, some netherland dwarf bunnies can have an attitude, but get a bunny that is part netherland, part mini rex and the bunny is much friendlier. Some people say this is true with dogs and cats also.

Birds are one of the few species of pet that can actually catch your cold or flu. So be very careful. If you are really sick with a bad cold, you may want someone else to care for your bird til you are better.

Rabbits tend to handle cold weather better than most animals. Guinea pigs and hamsters can get sick easily if their environment is too chilly. Chinchillas don't mind it a bit cool either.

Teddy bear hamsters with really long hair are usually males.

The feet of Siberian hamsters have thick fur on the bottom. It is cold in Siberia.

Syrian hamsters have pouches on the sides of their mouths to carry food collected in the desert to their den. Try giving them a thin carrot strip and watch them stuff it into their pouch, biting it off if it's too long. With the exception of male mice, small animals do not smell, dirty cages do.

Guinea pigs need Vitamin C in their diet because, just like you, they do not make it themselves. Some big breeders actually add a little bit of unsweetened orange juice to a guinea pig's bottle. Many guinea pigs will actually chew on an orange rind. The other small animals do. Chinchillas also benefit from extra vitamin C.

Gerbils drink very little water and often get enough from a small carrot treat. Change their water bottles every day so the water does not get stale.

Hamsters in the wild are solitary, A single hamster will be fine.

Many small animals are allergic to cedar bedding, so it is safer to stick with pine or one of the many recycled newspaper type beddings. Even just a small amount of cedar can cause a small animal to die.

Many will lose their fur and even get bloody noses. Beware of Department store pine. It sometimes has small amounts of cedar in it.

Gerbils make excellent pets, they drink very little, so they urinate very little, so they smell very little.

Rats make excellent pets. They are clean and very very smart. Very unlikely to bite.

Chinchillas can live to be 25 years old. All baby ferrets are descented, spayed and neutered at a very young age.

The shop receives 33 % of the selling price of each item and the contract runs for a 60 day period, so if you see something that catches your eye - buy it then as it may not be there when you come back. The good side of this is there is always something new when you stop in and not the same things you saw 6 months ago. There is new inventory coming through the door almost everyday. The inventory includes antique furniture, Depression glass, Waterford, Fenton Art

glass, Fostoria, Carnival, knick knacks, beautiful linens and doilies, Christmas tablecloths, plus a good selection of prints and art work. There is also a good selection of Gold, Sterling, vintage and modern Jewelry. The Birds Nest also buys Gold, Sterling Silver and other select items. Chip also puts selected items on eBay for her consignors if she feels this is the best way to sell the item. Some consignors like to price their own items and Chip will allow this as long as she feels the price is a sellable price. So if you have some items you would like to sell or some you would like to consign - stop and see Chip. She will make sure you get a fair price for your items. The Birds Nest does extend over into the bakery's dinning room where you can sit and have a pastry, a homemade egg salad sandwich on homemade bread, homemade soup or just to relax and think about purchases you would like to make. 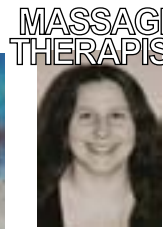

ARE YOU WORRIED ABOUT ANOTHER FLU OUTBREAK?

ALL OVER THE TELEVISION AND ad flyers they are promoting flu shots. I'm not worried and here's why. How well your body defends off potential pathogens depends on several layers of immune response. Your skin secretes oils that are slightly acidic and kill many pathogens on contact. Avoid stripping those oils away with soap. Use a pH-balanced cleanser. The hairs and mucous membranes in your nose and sinuses trap invaders that either get neutralized by nasal secretions or blown out onto a tissue. Saliva digests many invaders that make it into your mouth, and your tonsils secrete sticky mucous that acts like flypaper to trap invaders and digest them. Stomach acids digest invaders. And on the deepest level, the blood has many levels of "fight" including antibodies, white blood cells, phagocytes, and more. If you don't stay well with all these defenses in place, there must have been a chink in your armor.

What can you do to repair that chink? How can you prepare? What can you do to protect yourself and your family? Here are some practical things you can do and have on hand. First is to reduce stress. Studies over the years have shown us that stress reduction/control is a key building block to maintaining a strong immune system. Find constructive ways to off-load stress, make lifestyle changes to reduce stress. Play! Laugh! So many people are suffering from increased stress with the economy right now.

Second is to get enough rest. The more rundown you are, the weaker your immune system will be. Third is to get daily exercise. Keeping the lymphatic system healthy and clean, as can be done only through daily exercise, is most helpful. Thirty minutes each day of moderately intense active body movement is all it takes. Fourth is to eat healthful foods. Sugar-laden and chemical-rich foods stress the body. Sugar specifically paralyzes the white blood cells which are some of your deeper lines of defense. Dairy products increase our production of mucous – and while some mucous is helpful for trapping invaders, too much begins to clog the system and provides a cesspool for microorganisms to breed in. Eat basic, natural foods eliminating sugar and most dairy (butter is fine for most people).

The rest of what you need to do is easy! Fifth use essential oils. High-quality aromatherapy oils not synthetic ones kill air-borne pathogens. EOs can be effectively diffused in nebulizing diffusers. You can also make room sprays that can be used as surface cleaners. Here's how. Combine the following in a spritz bottle: 2 oz. purified water, 10 drops EO, 1 tsp. witch hazel. Which oils are best? Lavender, tea tree oil, eucalyptus and lemon are some of the most potent for disinfecting. Use the spray in the air and on surfaces. Be sure to not use this on wood products as it may ruin the finish. Make your own anti-bacterial hand soap (shower gel) and dish soap. Here's how: In a pump-top bottle combine 2 oz. This trio of herbs strengthens the lungs, liquefies mucous, and dilates bronchial passageways and could prove to be a very valuable asset in your herbal toolbox for any and all lung infections.

An ounce of prevention really is worth a pound of cure, so make that investment in prevention to minimize your risks of developing a flu this year.

TAKING CARE OF YOUR ART WORK

IF YOU OWN ART WORK that has value for you, be it personal or commercial, one should take care to preserve it and protect it. Sunlight, heat, dirt, and humidity are the enemies of art work.

Sunlight creates heat as well as ultraviolet radiation. Both these factors can damage oil paintings, water colors, photos, and prints, causing drying and fading. Fluorescent lights can cause art work to fade, as well.

To protect your art work, follow these guidelines:

Hang a picture away from any source of heat and light. An oil painting placed over a fireplace looks nice, but it's one of the worst spots to place it. The paint will dry out and flake off. Rising warm air carries dirt, which will be deposited on the painting. Do not hang a picture over a radiator or heat register, for the same reasons.

Avoid hanging art work in a spot that receives direct sunlight. The colors will certainly fade. Hang pictures on a south wall, if possible.

If hanging a heavy piece of art, place some angle brackets to hold the bottom edge. This will take pressure off the hook and wire, making the attachment more secure. Angle the art work so it tilts slightly forward. This will hide the angle brackets, and will allow air to circulate behind the picture, preventing condensation on it.

Never spray glass cleaner directly on the picture glass or frame. Instead, spray it on a soft cloth or paper towel, then wipe gently. This will prevent the liquid from running down the glass and getting behind it, damaging the picture.

Never clean a gilded frame with any liquid. Use a dry rag or feather duster to clean it.

Always mat your art work with an acid-free mat. It is made from rag fiber and is safe from fungi that cause mildew and the brown, staining marks known as "foxing." Foxing can sometimes be seen on old art work with the original mat made from wood pulp.

BIRTHDAY MONTH ANGELS

DURING THE 1950's, AND INTO the 1960's, every little girl wanted a ceramic angel that depicted her birthday month. They were made in Japan by companies such as Lefton, Enesco, and Napco. Woolworth's and like stores did a very good business selling them. They were inexpensive and very cute.

Each month reflected the season or holidays for that month. The March angel usually held a shamrock. The September angel held school-related items, etc. Mostly, the angels were female, though some male angels were manufactured. Since fewer of these were created, they are more scarce today, and thus more valuable.

Month angels have been reproduced. Telling the vintage from the new is relatively easy. The newer angels have cheaper production values. They rarely have any production numbers or company stickers on the base. As a rule, they run somewhat smaller than the vintage angels. The glazes are not as smooth and shiny.

In order to have any value, the month angel must be in perfect condition. There can be no chips, cracks, or glued-on parts. Always look at the wings carefully. They were the most likely to get broken and glued back on. Imperfect angels have no collectible value. Angels in perfect shape range in price from \$15.00 to \$25.00.

Applebees has many different beers available and a nice assortment of wines. They also have quite a few mixed drinks such as Bahama Mama, flavored Mojitos, the Hurricane, cosmopolitan and the mud slide. I guess I need to go back and try some of those.
