MUSIC MAN D.J. SERVICE GIVE THE "MUSIC MAN" A CALL FOR YOUR NEXT EVENT

THE LIFE OF A MOBILE DJ is an exciting wonderful career. My name is Jerry Ladd and I started my DJ business called "The Music Man" 26 years ago. We can do any kind of party, wedding or karaoke event. It started out as a part time job on the weekends, and is now a full time job. Generally I am doing 2 or 3 events each week. I employ 2 part time DJ's to help me. I've always been a collector of music ever since the age of 13. I acquired 4,000 33rpm records and 12,000 45rpm records. Today I have over 6,000 CD's in my collection. It only made sense to buy the DJ equipment I needed to start the "Music Man DJ Service". It's been great ever since. How many people can really say they love going to work and love their job? Well I do! Every day or party is totally different than the last one. Karaoke is a blast; you get singers who should be in Nashville, and some that should never sing except in their shower.

The DJ service extends to a 50 mile radius, and no party or wedding is too big or small. The key to this business is making people happy, dancing, and leaving the party saying what a great time they had. I grew up listening to the 1950's 60's, 70's, 80's, 90's, and today's music. This gives me a great advantage over the younger DJ's that think they know all that music. With 2 DJ's I have trained and know music we can do more than one party the same day. I update all my equipment every 2 years to keep up with the latest technology. The last thing

you want to happen is your equipment to break down during a wedding or party.

My business has expanded to lap top computer with 28,000 songs on the hard drive. It is so handy, if someone asks for a song you can type in the song title or artist. When you see the song you cursor down hit play and bingo the song is playing. What a time saver this is. I still carry 400-500 CD's for old time sake, or emergencies. Weddings or parties can get expensive. I may charge \$250 for a party, and other DJ's will charge \$650 for the exact same thing. I even played my nieces wedding in Maryland. I do not believe in overcharging people because some DJ companies believe they will never see these people again and that makes it ok. The day this job is no longer fun is the day I retire.

This has been such a rewarding career. There is nothing better than to see people happy, dancing, and forgetting their daily problems and jobs. We have 21 years experience doing Karaoke, doing 2-3 nights every week. Currently we have 55,000 songs on karaoke. We do have all our karaoke songs on hard drives on our laptop computers. That way we won't have to carry karaoke CD's anymore. Updating is very important. People want to sing the latest song as well as the old standards. Equipment today is smaller, lighter, with much better sound. Speakers have built in amplifiers with 450 watts of power each. Mixers, CD decks are smaller and lighter. Set up times are 20 minutes. I used to spend an hour setting up years ago. Karaoke has been a great part of my life being in Elmira, Auburn, Ithaca, Dryden, Cortland, and many other locations.

The "Music Man" has over 80,000 songs for regular parties. "I love to take requests" says Jerry. I am confident I will have the song requested or an alternate song. Some people love to give you a song just hoping you will never have it! So how does Jerry Ladd bring so much experience as a DJ and so many songs to a party? "I've always had a love for music," says Jerry. I buy at least 20 CD's every month to keep up with all the latest music. We get the same promotional CD's as radio stations get, which contain the latest radio hits, rhythm, urban, and country hits.

Our DJ service also does the after-school programs at 5-6 schools in the area. We go into the school for 2 hours and let the kids sing karaoke. They have such a ball, and it is non stop karaoke the whole time we are there. At weddings I keep the music low so people can talk. Later on we can crank up the music when people are ready to party and dance. "I would rather have someone ask me to turn the music up rather than down." Jerry says!

THE GREAT CORTLAND PUMPKINFEST A COMMUNITY EFFORT

IN 1996 COMMUNITY MEMBERS OF Cortland gathered to organize an annual event, the Great Cortland Pumpkinfest. The Crown City started the festival as a way for the agricultural-based area to “celebrate the harvest season” and bring the county together. Community involvement and participation has lead to the success of the festival that takes place each year during the first weekend of October. People have embraced the event and each year as autumn approaches, they look forward to attending the Pumpkinfest. Each year the festival has grown larger and attracted more and more people from the neighboring communities. This year’s annual festivities will take place on Saturday, October 6 from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM and Sunday, October 7 from 12 noon to 5:00 PM.

Behind the scenes area individuals and businesses expend much time and energy to accommodate the interests of the community. Preparations begin many months prior to the two-day event as volunteers unite to coordinate the details that create a memorable time for anyone who attends the festival.

Attractions are family-centered and include a petting zoo, hayrides, pony rides, children’s games and entertainment, music, crafters, food sales. An annual favorite is the giant pumpkin weigh -off and a relatively new event, the pumpkin drop. New this year is Antique Fair, where antique items will be displayed and available for sale.

This year the Pumpkinfest Committee will be offering a cookbook titled “Harvest Delectable’s”. This collection of 250 recipes submitted by community members can be purchased for \$10 and all of the proceeds will go towards helping to offset the cost of putting on the event. The cookbook is dedicated in memory of Carol Deloff, a founding committee member who passed away in November 2011.

Even if you are unfamiliar with the Pumpkinfest, you will notice a flurry of activity in the days leading up to the event. If you drive across Church Street in downtown a couple days prior to the festival you will notice that, much like when the circus comes to town, tents will begin popping up inside Court House Park. You will also see various size pumpkins decorating the park’s fountain at the end of West Court Street. About 300 of the bright orange squash-type vegetable adorn the festival.

Pumpkins are used not only as an autumn decoration but also as a nutritious source of food. Mashed pumpkin is used mainly in desserts – the most popular being a custard pie. For the last 15 years the United Presbyterian Church, located nearby at 25 Church Street, bakes between 350 and 380 pumpkin pies that are sold at the festival. Any member of the church congregation is welcome to help roll the piecrust, prepare the filling and bake this favorite dessert that is sold at the festival. Two sizes of pie or a single piece are available to purchase. Linda Parker, who coordinates the pie baking, says the ladies who participate donate their time because they “really enjoy it.” In addition to the sale of pumpkin pies, the church will be preparing a Pumpkin Pancake Supper the evening before, Friday, October 5th from 4:30 to 7:00 PM in the church’s dining hall.

During the two-day festival you may notice antique tractors traveling the streets of Cortland. Members of Tractors of Yesteryear (TOY) operate the old-fashioned hayrides. The TOY club has been involved with the festival for over ten years. The first couple of years, semi-modern tractors were used to pull the wagons but in recent years, the antiques perform the work. The antique tractors are rotated throughout the two-day affair. They take turns resting and are displayed in the small parking lot adjacent to the park. During the festival, club members sell theater-type popcorn and raffle tickets. Club member Roger Karn says of the volunteers, it is “something we like to do.” The Saturday prior to the festival, September 29th TOYs is hosting an antique tractor show and pull at the Central New York Living History Center on Homer Avenue.

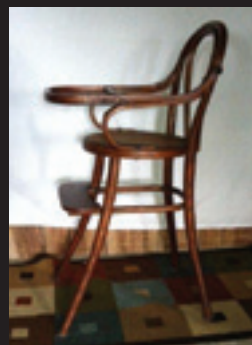

MIKE'S FISH TANK HAMSTERS

INSTEAD OF FISH THIS WEEK, I want to talk about hamsters. A lot of people have hamsters and here is some info on them.

Generally hamsters live 2 to 3 years. The most common problem they face is wet tail. This is usually caused by stress. It causes massive diarrhea and can and will kill your hamster if not treated right away. There is a product called dri tail which usually works well if used in the beginning stages of wet tail. Hamsters can catch colds easily, so keep them away from drafts. If a hamster falls out of your hand onto the floor, it could seriously hurt itself, even die. Be sure to hold your hamster over a bed or down low, so if it falls, the hamster will have a better chance of not being injured.

Hamsters can have babies every 19-21 days, and they can start producing young at an early age. You do not need to remove the father. If a parent decides to kill the babies, it is usually the mom, not the dad. Some first time moms don't know what to do and they may not take care of their babies. The next time she has babies, she usually does a much better job. Never feed Department or grocery store foods. It usually is not as fresh and a lot of the nutrition is lost thus shortening your hamsters life. We suggest seed as more of a treat. We prefer the square meal chunks. Hamsters love it. It's a chunky food that also helps keep the animals teeth filed down. Plus it is filled with all kinds of minerals and vitamins. For treats, maybe a little bit of carrot, but just a little. They also make a variety of hamster treats which we stock right here at our store. Those are made especially for hamsters and are safe.

When you first get your new hamster home, give him a few days to settle in. He or she will be afraid after being in a box, a car ride and then having all those new smells at your house. Sometimes they are more apt to bite when they are scared. So let them settle in before handling too much. Also, a lot of hamsters and other small animals are allergic to cedar bedding. To be on the safe side use pine or fresh world. They are safe and will not harm your pet. Some Department store sell a pine cedar mix so be careful where you buy your bedding. Many small animals can die after being exposed to cedar bedding

TAKING CARE OF YOUR PET'S HEALTH CHALLENGES NATURALLY CONCLUSION

BEFORE I FINISH THIS SERIES on taking care of our pets naturally, I want to congratulate the CAT and Judy and her team for 10 years. That is quite an accomplishment these days. Now on to my column.

Cataracts: I was surprised with the number of people asking about cataracts in their pets. I know this happens to people but animals have a harder time compensating for the loss of their vision. I don't

think they make doggie glasses yet! There is a lens over the eye. When the body has calcium it cannot utilize it sometimes deposits the calcium in the lens. This is basically a cataract. Milk, cheese and dairy products in general are the worse culprits for this happening. I suggest you do not give it to your animals. A lack of magnesium can cause it as well. Do not add straight magnesium to your animal's diet without the help of your vet or herbalist. There is a balanced calcium/magnesium supplement called Skeletal Strength which I strongly suggest. There is an herbal combination called EW which helps clean out the calcium in the lens. I have heard of animals and people alike have the lens restored to a clear membrane that it should be.

Dry Skin: Dry skin could be a sign that your dog's health is not what it should be. As I have stated before good quality food is essential even if you do supplement. I saw on TV that some dog food companies pick up some of its protein from rotten road kill. Yuck! Aside from poor food the two main causes of dry skin is over-shampooing or the lack of fatty acids. If you give your pet liquid chlorophyll the necessity of bathing will not be as frequent. If over grooming or health is not the problem the I would suspect a fatty acid deficiency. I suggest using flaxseed oil. It contains Omega 3, 6 and 9. Dogs lap it up off the spoon. Occasionally dry skin can also be caused by a thyroid issue. If the fur is thin that is one sign. Kelp is hard to get down an animal. But it can be mixed in some soft food.

Feline Pan Leukopenia: This is usually caused by a virus. The Chinese herbal combination VS-C has produced amazing results on humans and can be used on animals as well. I even carry it in liquid form so it is easy to administer to animals. The dosage would be 1 dropper full of VS-C 4 times a day for an average size cat. More if it is a large cat. No known toxic level so you can adjust dosage.

Fleas: Pet owners spent an average of one billion dollars on flea control products. Mind boggling. There are different kinds of fleas. Cat fleas, dog fleas, rabbit fleas to name a few. They can cause some health problems in an animal such as anemia and also spread Lyme disease. It can also be an indication that your animal's health is a little under par. Healthy animals do not harbor fleas. So what happens if you see the spots on spot jumping? First clean the sleeping and living quarters of your pet. The herb pennyroyal planted around where your dog plays can considerably cut down on the chances of flea infestation. Bathe your animal unless it is a cat with shampoo laced with Tea Tree oil. Give your pets Herbal Trace Minerals and garlic making the conditions on your animals unfavorable to fleas. Check for fleas often in the warmer season.

Hot Spots: The origin of hot spots is toxicity, deficiencies, boredom and habit. The skin of an animal can be itchy from flaky, dry, yeasty skin. Typically you can use Tea Tree oil. A good blood cleanser is Red Clover Blend and Liver Cleanse. For dry skin, nothing can beat Flaxseed Oil. Sometimes after a skin condition is remedied, the animal out of habit will chew or lick at the area where the hot spot used to be. If it is a nervous dog, Chinese Stress Relief and Flaxseed Oil are suggested. If nerves are not involved, you could put some capsaicin on the area. The hot taste will deter your pet from chewing.

That is all for this three part series. There is more information but I think I have given you enough for now.

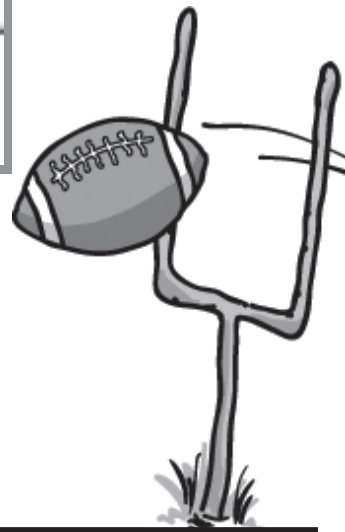

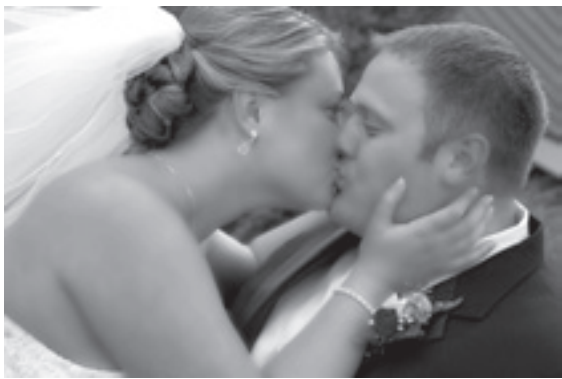

“ALL BECAUSE TWO PEOPLE FELL in Love,” is printed on signs, picture frames, shelf sitters, border bytes and more. It is a phrase that never grows old. It seems to be one of our most popular wedding gift sayings, which is no surprise. Brides who walk through the shop with me during their free wedding registry set-up, frequently add at least one item with this saying to the list of gifts on their registry.

Other popular phrases for wedding gifts include, “Always Kiss Me Goodnight,” and “And they lived happily ever after” but by far, “All Because Two People Fell in Love,” is the best selling. Perhaps, this is why it is this exact phrase that often runs through my mind as I am shooting a wedding or editing wedding photos-- looking through my camera lense, I watch the ring exchange, the kiss, the first dance, or the cake cutting and I find myself thinking, “all because two people fell in love...”

Whether I am walking through the shop with a bride-to-be (or a bride and groom) or shooting engagement or wedding photos, I love working on weddings. When else do you see two people MORE in love and happier than you do at a wedding? It is the best. For me, it is a means of restoring my faith in fairy tales and happily ever after. I can walk away from a wedding (that I photographed) thoroughly exhausted yet completely exhilarated by newlywed faith, hope and love.

Wedding shoots frequently begin with nails, hair and make-up appointments for the bride and bridesmaids. I click pictures of stylists who skillfully sweep hair into spectacular up-dos, make-up artists who use airbrushing to apply a flawless foundation for their masterpieces. I click picture after picture of bridal suites, flowers, jewelry, shoes and even lingerie. I capture the bride's mother as she sheds the first of many tears while fastening a wedding gown, adjusting a veil or clipping a necklace; I photograph the father of the bride when he first sees his daughter in her dress-- his breath momentarily taken away by this stunning bride who was, not that long ago, his “little girl.” I carry tissues in my camera bag-- for parents and guests but, also, for me. Between shots, as needed, I lower my camera and offer nervous grooms words of encouragement, worried brides a hug or a quick hand squeeze. I point the young flower girl down the aisle or put a finger to my lips to try and quiet the toddling ring bearer – all the while marveling at how lucky I am to be a part of such a happy day.



As another summer comes to a close, I am inundated with editing wedding photos. Weighing heavily on my mind are thoughts of my many eager newlyweds patiently waiting for me to finish their galleries and plans for the upcoming fall wedding schedule. An average wedding results in over 1,000 image files and, in the last five weeks, I've shot three weddings. I have two more weddings in the next five weeks.

My editing process is always the same. I upload images from my camera cards to my computer. I preview each enlarged photo, critical of exposure, focus, lighting, and subject matter. I delete photos of brides who blinked mid-shutter, making their shadowed eyelids appear heavy and drooping. I apply blemish fixes to photos of bridesmaids who awoke that morning with a giant pimple on their chin or nose or forehead. I brighten the hungover groomsmen's eyes and clean up the groom's five o'clock shadow. I quickly trash any mistakes--photos that are distorted, way over (or under) exposed. If the wedding photos took six hours to shoot, the editing will take twelve hours or more. Edited photos are then uploaded to online galleries, where they can be proofed by my newlyweds. I want each photo to accurately represent the beauty of the day, the venue, the guests, the meal, the cake, the music and, most importantly, the bride and groom and their anticipation, excitement, happiness and love. It is a painstaking process that I perform with a careful eye and a steady hand, all the while thinking to myself, “All because two people fell in love.”
