CRT PRESENTS REGIONAL PREMIERE OF AGATHA CHRISTIE'S "CARDS ON THE TABLE"

F or the fourth show in their 45th anniversary summer season, Cortland Repertory Theatre presents the regional premiere of the exciting murder mystery "*Cards on the Table*" adapted by Leslie Darbon from the novel by Agatha Christie. Performances will run from August 3rd – 13th with evening performances at 7:30 PM. Matinees are available on August 5th, 9th and 10th at 2:00 PM. This rarely produced Christie classic is a mystery lover's dream. Mr. Shaitana is a strange and wealthy collector of various kinds of art. One evening he invites Superintendent Battle of Scotland Yard and crime novelist Ariadne Oliver to a dinner party to view his latest "collection": four people who have committed murder and gotten away with it. But during a game of bridge with the group in a closed room, Shaitana himself is daringly murdered! Battle sets out to solve the crime but can he catch the murderer before they lay their cards on the table for the final time? Directing this production is CRT's Producing Artistic Director Kerby Thompson, whose previous directing projects at CRT include "1776", "Unnecessary Farce", "The Ladies Man", "Buddy! The Buddy Holly Story" and many others. The cast is comprised of many actors who have previously performed at CRT. Heading the cast as Inspector Battle is Arthur Lazalde, who was seen last summer as John Dickenson in "1776". Crime novelist Ariadne Oliver is portrayed by Wendy Bagger, who has appeared in "Always a Bridesmaid", "Sherlock Holmes and the Case of the Jersey Lily", and "Boeing Boeing" at CRT. Also returning are Mary Williams as Mrs. Lorrimer and Richard Daniel as Dr. Roberts. Williams was seen in CRT's "Six Dance Lessons in Six Weeks", "A Murder is Announced", and "The Hollow" while Daniel played Benjamin Franklin in last summer's "1776". Ithaca College student Daniel Wisniewski who was a CRT performing intern last summer, will play adventurer Major Despard. Three performing interns this year are also playing major roles: Caroline Kane as Anne Meredith, Erica Rothman as Rhoda Dawes and Richard Westfahl as Stephens. Jason Shipman, seen in last summer's "Miracle on South Division Street", plays Sergeant O'Connor, and Jennifer Brunker in her CRT debut plays Miss Burgess, the Doctor's secretary. Completing the cast is local talent Mark Re as the ill fated Shaitana. Re performed with CRT in "1776" and "The Smell of the Kill".

Stage Manager Erin E. Heare leads the design and production team. Shelley Barrish returns having previously designed "*West Side Story*" earlier this summer. Costumes are created by long-time CRT Costume Designer Wendi R. Zea. Continuing their work this season are Lighting Designer David Sexton, Props Designer Joe Dotts, Sound Designer Seth Asa Sengel, Technical Director Dana White Jr. and Assistant Stage Manager Julianne Graffeo.

MIKE'S FISH TANK HERMIT CRABS

NSTEAD OF FISH THIS WEEK, we will talk about hermit crabs. INSTEAD OF FISH THIS WHER, ... They are a very popular pet especially kids.

A lot of people will go on vacation to the beach and bring back hermit crabs. I have been selling hermit crabs for 26 years and I have learned a lot from the big distributors about these cute little crabs.

They do not eat very much so feed accordingly. I put a little warm water in the sink and

sprinkle some hermit crab food around the edge of the water. This simulates the way the crabs eat around and near water. It also keeps your hermit crab home cleaner, because when they are done eating, you can just add water and swish any leftover food down the drain.In the winter you can add a heat lamp or undertank heater to be sure the hermits are warm enough. This time of the year, it is warm enough and you shouldn't need any heat sources.

Be sure to keep a dish of water in their home, they need moisture. If they don't have enough humidity, they will have a hard time shedding their skin and they can die. They make hermit crab sponges. Keep one of these wet in your crabs home all time. This will add humidity to the habitat and will benefit your hermit crab. Normally hermit crabs get along with each other but they do fight sometimes.You might find a loose claw here and there, a definite sign that they may be fighting. Remember they are called HERMIT crabs, hermit means alone, so if you see signs of fighting, you may need a bigger home or take out the crab who might be the fighter.

Once a week give your crab a warm bath in just a little bit of water in the sink, this will help keep his skin moist and aid him in shedding.

Another fun fact of hermit crabs is if you add shells to their home, they may change into those shells off and on.

It all depends on whether they like the shells you give them, but it is cool to watch them change from one shell into the next.They make a big variety of hermit crab foods and treats. A balanced diet is always a good thing.

If you want to put a branch or stone from outside into your crabs home, be sure to sterilize it with boiling water so no bad things get into your crabs home.

In 1983 he started our club Finger Lakes, With 2 microds & 2 drivers. Since the start of our club A.J. has given 653 kids the opportunity to try microd racing thru his rent-a-microd program. (Currently 88.53% of all drivers in the club's history have won a race) That's 710 of 802 drivers (thru 33 seasons so far)

ITHACA DIRT RIDERS SPEEDSVILLE ENDURO AND YOUTH CLOSED COURSE ENDURO - TWO DAY EVENT: AUGUST 20 - AUGUST 21, 2016

In the EARLY 1970's, A small group of local off-road motorcycle enthusiasts came together to form the Ithaca Dirt Riders (IDR). It was their vision to provide some local trails and events for their club members and other to enjoy. A year later, the club chartered with the American Motorcyclist Association (AMA). With many of its member interested in the AMA sport of Enduros, the club sanctioned its first event.

This year is the 43rd anniversary of The **Ithaca Dirt Riders "Speedsville Enduro**"! It will be held on **Sunday, August 21** and starts at the Speedsville Sports Field on West Creek Road in Berkshire, starting at 8:00 am. There are no spectator fees and we have information sheets available to see where the riders will be during the event. There is even a great chicken barbeque lunch provided by the Speedsville Fire Department available to purchase and t-shirts sold to commemorate the event.

Also this year, the Ithaca Dirt Riders are continuing their effort to involve youth rider. On **Saturday, August 20**th, we will be holding a **youth closed course enduro** for **ages 7 to 15 years old** and 52+ cc bikes (shorter than the adult ride and less intense), on McMahon Road in Berkshire. It consists of a series of "loops" through fields and woods. SO, WHAT IS AN ENDURO?

Enduros are a cross-country event, which not only requires speed and ability, but also endurance, (hence "Enduro"), with the courses taking at least five hours to complete. The rider must also stay on time. A route is laid out for the riders to follow and a speed is set for them to maintain. Small groups of riders, (usually four), are started every minute. The rider must then try to maintain the speed scheduled for any given area. To score the riders, the promoter has secret "check points" along the route. If he/she is not on time, they are given 1 point for every minute they are late. Being early is much worse, with 2 points for the first 2 minutes that you are early and 5 points for every minute earlier than that and disqualification if you are more than 15 minutes early. Like golf, at the end of the event the scores are added up and the




