





LET'S TALK DOGS: SOCIALIZATION

THIS IS NOT ABOUT AGGRESSION. This is about socialization:

▲ what it is and what it isn't. We socialize dogs so we can share social experiences together: exercise, leisurely walks, old friends and family, new friends and family. You want your dog to tolerate vet, groomer, boarding kennel without incident.

Some dogs love "social," some don't. Some are resilient, "go with the flow" dogs. Some aren't. How do we socialize? The rules for puppies are a bit different but here are the basics.

Teach your dog manners that apply at home and out-and-about.

Keep him on- leash while you're training until he's reliable. The leash is your friend if used correctly and humanely.

A leash restricts a dog's ability to communicate in the ways that dogs communicate, but we start teaching good manners

on-leash so you can practice good manners safely anywhere you go.

Dogs speak and read body language. Grow at least a basic understanding of what your dog is saying to you and other dogs. A stiff body and a wagging tail is NOT a friendly dog. A staring dog is NOT a friendly dog.

A good choice for a meet-and-greet : a well-mannered dog who is not pulling, paying attention to her owner, loose wiggly enthusiasm, play bows, open mouth, soft happy eyes.

Never force a dog face-to-face with another dog or person. Your dog doesn't have to schmooze every dog and person he sees. It's not safe.

If you meet-and-greet on-leash, watch your dog. Don't let the leashes get tangled.

Many dogs are friendlier off-leash than on. Keep on-leash meet-and-greets short and safe. If you want the dogs to play, meet some place where you can let them off leash.

Know your dog. If your dog or the other dog doesn't want to say hi (either dog is looking away or moving away), keep going!

If your dog is hanging around you or trying to hide, your dog doesn't feel safe. Acknowledge it. Take your dog and move

on. Come back another time. Dogs don't enjoy social encounters if they don't feel safe.

The hardest task of all: control the people around your dog! Both bossy and shy dogs need you to take charge. Keep it safe for the dog, from the dog's point of view, and for those around him.

A well-socialized dog can relax, ignore dogs and people unless invited, give you attention, obey your commands, play safely with other dogs off-leash, tolerate handling by vet, groomer, and friends.

Some dogs don't like groups, unfamiliar dogs or people but most dogs, given enough space

and training can learn

Some History of the Village of Whitney Point and the **Restaurant Site**

Whitney Point was settled in 1797 and incorporated in 1871. In 1824 it was named for its Postmaster, Thomas Whitney and called Whitney's Point. The village has survived fires and floods to become the wholesome village that it is today. Griffin's block, the current site of Aiello's Restaurant, burned in April 1897. The fire started in the store's basement and razed the entire business section of the village. Businessmen built a wooden shanty town on the school house grounds to house facilities for temporary stores following the fire. The Hotel Griffin was built on the site of the Griffin block. Construction was completed the night before a planned celebration of the reconstruction of the village in 1899. It was an imposing building with a public room, dining room, lobby and kitchen on the first floor and twenty sleeping rooms above. It had electricity and steam heat. In 1912 the Hotel Griffin was sold and renamed the Otselic Inn. It became a Temperance Hotel, housing group meetings. It was the best place in town to go for Sunday dinner and still is. The Otselic Inn bar reopened in 1933 when beverages with 3.2% alcohol became legal. The Aiello family purchased the building in May 1982.

In the mid-1930s a flood ravaged the village, nearly wiping it out. In 1936, President F.D. Roosevelt visited the village and made a commitment to construct a Flood Control Dam on the Otselic River. The dam impounds a reservoir that not only protects the village but provides a beautiful recreational lake. The village history includes the site where the Whitney automobile was manufactured in 1901. This automobile sold for \$850 or \$880 with fenders. Whitney Point is now the site of the annual Broome County Fair, an annual Rotary Canoe Regatta and the annual New York State Crappie Derby.

The Aiello family feels very fortunate to be a part of this community. We enjoy improving this facility with it's rich history, and making it more attractive and comfortable for our guests.

LOST DOGS OF THE FINGER Lakes on Facebook

OUR MISSION AT LOST DOGS of the Finger Lakes is to help the lost become found. Recently, I spoke with a wonderful woman who had found a dog. We posted the dog on our page and while the owner was found and positively identified in a matter of a few hours, it was not before the finder received a handful of calls from other people professing to be the dog's owner. One caller even claimed to be the neighbor of the owner but when questioned, couldn't give simple identifying information.

But there are lessons here, and ones that we need your help in sharing far and wide. People with bad intentions for our beloved pets are watching our page and others like it. They also ride the roads looking for pets that aren't secured or being monitored. They are attempting to steal dogs or claim dogs that are not theirs and the reasons why are all bad; dog fighting, selling to labs for testing, adding to their hoarding collection, flipping...it's an endless and terrifying list.

What can you, as the finder or owner, do? First and most importantly (as we've always preached) call your local Dog Control Officer (DCO) and file a lost or found report. Calling your DCO is not optional - it is a legal requirement. This report helps you and helps your dog. It creates a legal paper trail that will help to identify your dog when found or will help to prosecute someone who may have found your dog....and kept them. Second, this is for you the finder, when an individual calls or arrives to claim ownership, insist on proof. Ask for vet records, licensing documentation, or even photos. If the individual claiming ownership cannot show proof, call your local police department or DCO right away and let them sort it out.

Third, and this is for you the owner, make sure your dog is licensed and wearing their tags. This registration is required by law and serves as proof of ownership and is a vital link to getting your dog safely home should they ever become lost.

What can we, as a community, do? We can educate about the role of our DCOs and the importance of licensing. We can make sure that we're aware of the dangers out there for these dogs and protect them with everything we do. Thank you to all who share our posts...you've saved countless lives.

SUMMER HEAT MEANS USING EXTRA CAUTION WHEN TRAVELING WITH PETS ALLSTATE NEW YORK SHARES TIPS ON HOW TO PROTECT YOUR PET IN THE CAR



THE DOG DAYS OF SUMMER are L upon us, but that doesn't mean your dog, cat, or other animal has to suffer if they travel with you. On an 85 degree day, it takes only ten minutes for the inside of your car to reach 102° and after a half hour, it can reach 120° – even with the windows left slightly open, according to the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA). That could mean

if the only option is to leave your pet in the car, they might be safer at home.

As Allstate helps protect your auto, the company also shares some tips below from the <u>ASPCA and The Humane Society of</u> <u>the United States</u> to help protect your pet from the summer heat in the car.

First, be on the lookout for possible symptoms of overheating in your dog or cat such as:

- 1. Heavy panting
- 2. Glazed eyes
- 3. Rapid breathing or pulse
- 4. Staggering walk
- Weakness or unsteadiness 5.
- Vomiting, or a deep red or purple tongue

When breathing suddenly becomes quiet with any of these symptoms, the animal may collapse. An animal affected by heat stroke can die in minutes, but proper care may save its life.

Second, learn a few possible treatment options for overheating before you ever put a pet in the car. For example,

Safely and immediately remove the animal from its hot environment, to a safe, shaded area, if possible.

Slowly cool the animal by placing it in cool, not cold, water. Reduce body heat gradually. You can place cool, wet towels over the back of the neck, in the armpits, and in the groin area. You may also wet the ear flaps and paws with cool water.

If possible, a breeze from the wind or a fan directed 3. to wet areas of the animal's body will help with cooling.

Take the distressed pet to a veterinarian as soon as possible. Treatment for dehydration and other serious problems may be necessary.

Third, don't be afraid to act. If you see an animal locked in a car on a hot day, you should:

Try to locate the owner as quickly as possible. If the car is parked at a store, take down the car's make, model and license plate number, then ask a store employee to page the owner

If the owner cannot be found quickly, call the nonemergency number of the local police or animal control and wait by the car for them to arrive.

You can be prepared in advance by gathering the essential telephone numbers and have them on hand. You'll want to have your local animal control agency's number and the police department's non-emergency number so you can quickly report the situation. Keep these numbers in your purse, your car's glove compartment, or programmed into your phone.

MIKE'S FISH TANK CICHLIDS

ICHLIDS ARE MEMBERS OF A group known as the Labroidei. CThis family is both large and diverse. At least 1,650 species have been scientifically described. New species are discovered annually, and many species remain undescribed.

The actual number of species is therefore unknown, with estimates varying between 2,000 and 3,000. Cichlids are among the most popular freshwater fish kept in the home aquarium.

Many cichlids, particularly tilapia, are important food fishes, while others are valued game fish. The family also includes many familiar aquarium fish, including the angelfish, oscars, and discus. Cichlids have the largest number of endangered species among vertebrate families.

Cichlids are particularly well known for having evolved rapidly into a large number of closely related diverse species within large lakes, particularly Tanganyika, Victoria, Malawi, and Edward. Many cichlids that have been introduced into waters outside of their natural range have become nuisances, such as tilapia in the southern United States.

Cichlids are efficient and often highly specialized feeders that capture and process a very wide variety of food items. This is assumed to be one reason why they are so diverse. Cichlids vary in body shape, ranging from compressed and discshaped to triangular to elongate and cylindrical. Cichlids are the most species-rich family in freshwaters worldwide. They are most diverse in Africa and South America. It is estimated that Africa alone hosts at least 1,600 species. Central America and Mexico have approximately 120 species, as far north as the Rio Grande in southern Texas. Madagascar has its own distinctive species.

Many cichlids are primarily herbivores feeding on algae and plants. Small animals, particularly invertebrates, are only a minor part of their diet. Other cichlids are detritivores and eat all types of organic material. And other cichlids are predatory and eat little or no plant matter. Their main diet being small fish and insects.



BIKING WITH YOUR DOG

Do YOU MOUNTAIN BIKE? Do you have a good friend that watches you pull out the driveway as you leave for your ride? Your dog can also enjoy the fun and benefits of being in the woods or on trails as well. Dogs have a lot of energy and require exercise just like you or I. Depending on the type of dog you have will determine the extent of running he can do. Most medium to large size dogs from the hunting or working class groups (or a combination there of) do well with biking. Obviously a little dog with short legs will have a tough time trying to keep up. If you have a four legged buddy you want to take out on the trail for the first time it would be a good idea to talk to your dog's veterinarian about what you have in mind for him. It is important that your dog can deal with the rigors and intensity of a trail run. Mountain bikes can move right along at a good pace and cover many trail miles.

If the dog is just a puppy, it's recommended to leave him home until he is least 6 months old. After he has gotten a little older, start your first slow and short ride someplace where you can work out the little details. Dogs are instinctively pack animals and if you lead they will follow. Since he will be off the leash for the ride/run he needs to know a few important commands. The most important ones are "stay" and "come". Control of Fido is very important because of all the distractions on the trail. Distractions come in many forms, such as other people and possibly their dogs, horses, deer and vehicles. If you start your ride from spot near a busy road, it might be a good idea to keep him on a leash until you are ready to leave for the ride.

I have found another good way to break him in is to take him on a group ride with other well behaved dogs. He will most likely

be so excited to be in the woods, around you and the other dogs that he will follow without question; again it's the pack idea.

Before you hit the trail you should have a check list for Fido. Your list should include a water bottle just for him, a leash, and some first aid supplies and maybe some treats to lure him back when he strays (cut up hot dogs in a baggie worked for me).

So, you and dog are headed down the trail, now what? Well you'll find that while you are following some kind of trail, your 4-legged buddy will be running from one side of the trail to the other, smelling all those scent's that drive dogs nuts. Some dogs can put on half again as many miles as the rider, so keep that in mind when watching your mileage because he will have more. Most dogs will want to be out front, but because of their sniffing, they may lag for a few seconds and then come charging up thru. It's important for you to hold your line, because that is what the dog is expecting. A few things that the new trail dog must learn and that is to stay away from the bike's front wheel or even stopping in the middle of the trail, not good. Usually if you shout "Go!" works, but sometimes a collision happens. Both you and the dog need to be alert and aware of what is going on. Sometimes a friendly low speed bump from your front wheel to the dog's rump or tail can quickly bring this point clear. A few applications of this can burn it into his mind. An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.

There are some young dogs that have so much energy or get so excited when they get out on the trail that controlling them can be a real handful if not near impossible. You need to evaluate the excitable boy or in our case the Crazy Daisy. She has not given us the confidence to just let her run, until then we keep working with her on a 30ft lead. We have had great luck with our last two trail huskies but this one needs more

attention before she can go free. The last thing we want is for her to take off on us and end up lost.

Some people I have talked to have had good luck with training collars for dogs "off leash" in the woods. Some people don't like them but if done properly they can keep the dog with you, safe and sound. With something like this it requires time and work but it may be the best way to train a stubborn dog.

Mountain biking with your dog can be a challenge, but patience and time will make it worth the effort. Just remember, that it will be difficult to pull out the driveway without taking your riding buddy along.


