WELCOME TO THE FARM

JUST NORTH OF CORTLAND, IN the Town of Homer, lives a herd of 80 Alpacas who love to hang out in their pasture; about a dozen Guinea Hens who love to eat bugs; a couple of great cats who love a good ear scratch and to hunt mice; four chickens who love blueberries; and their humans, Ken and Brenda Clark who - love all of them.

The alpacas, the cats, the guinea hens, the chickens and the Clarks didn't always live together. Ken and Brenda lived in a house about 50 miles away and a few of the alpacas lived on a farm in a different town. When the Clarks decided that they would like to live on a farm, they spoke to some people about how to take care of alpacas. Some of the things they wanted to know were what kind of dwellings alpacas needed, what kind of food they ate, how healthy they were and what kind of medicines they needed. They also wanted to know if this member of the camelid family could live comfortably in Central New York. Other good questions they had were: how long do alpacas live and what happens if they wanted to breed the alpacas.

So, in 2001, Ken and Brenda bought three alpacas. Another soon followed. They visited their new friends as often as they could, usually every weekend, to give them treats and to get to know them. Finally, in 2003 - after months of searching - the Clarks found their own farm and everyone moved in. Everyone, that is, except the cats - they already lived there and welcomed all of the new tenants. They named the farm

In the eastern US there is a parasite that is dangerous for alpacas so the guinea hens were brought to live on the farm to eat that parasite. Guinea hens - who everyone

births and sicknesses and have great veterinarians who help out when needed. Shots are given once a month to help keep that parasite away and shearing day every spring is a time for friends to come help and have fun - but everyone is happy when that day is over. It is exciting when a new baby (cria) comes into the world and it is fun to watch it grow, running around the pasture chasing after guinea hens. Spring and Fall are always a busy time of year taking some of the young stock and herd sires to events all over to show them off. There are some proud alpacas on this farm who have earned many blue ribbons for their strong frame and wonderfully soft fleece.

All of the fleece from the animals at Tartan Acres is sent away to be made in to yarn or rovings. Some of the yarn comes back to the farm to be sold to people who like to knit or crochet and

> rovings are available for people who like to spin their own yarn. For people who like to wear gloves, hats, mittens, scarves, sweaters, etc, there are some very nice items for sale that are already knitted. Ken and Brenda built a shop in the barn and enjoy having people come to shop and check out the herd at Christmas time.

> Another time to come to the farm is on the last Saturday of September. That day

was proclaimed National Llama and Alpaca Day and many farms hold special welcoming events that day for people to stop in and see what it is like to live with alpacas.

When Ken and Brenda are not busy in the barn taking care of the alpacas, or on the back deck visiting with their chickens, they can be seen caring for the gardens or working to restore their old house that was build in 1863. Some day they hope to turn it into a B&B – another way of sharing the farm with other people. So, if you've ever thought of owning an alpaca, want a unique gift, or just need a few hours of rest and relaxation, plan on stopping by – everyone looks forward to seeing you.

THE EVOLUTION OF THE WEDDING

PEOPLE FREQUENTLY ASK ME IF shooting wedding is difficult. My answer remains consistent, "I love shooting weddings because when else do we get to see two people so in love and so many people so happy about it???"

It should come as no surprise to anyone that wedding customs, like everything else, over the course of time, change. Some of the *more traditional* wedding customs— like bachelor parties, tiered cakes, garter toss, bridal bouquets and massive feasts stem from medieval times and have long held a place at the wedding table but as times

change, customs evolve. Wedding photography can be traced back to the 1840's. While photography back then was used primarily for commercial purposes, photographers began shooting weddings as a way to preserve special memories and thankfully, this custom has continued—and also evolved.

As a wedding photographer, I witness evolutions of customs first-hand. Often, I am asked for my opinion on specific wedding details and I have to subtly remind brides and grooms (and sometimes parents) that the wedding should



reflect the wishes of the two people marrying and what they want— not what I (or anyone else) want. With this in mind, I work with couples to plan their day, their way.

Had someone told my Grandmother, on her wedding day—in the 1930's, that her granddaughter would one day be shooting weddings in barns, on tropical beaches or on a city skyscraper rooftop, she would've laughed that person out of the church!

But, to keep everything in perspective, Grandma's 1930's bridal bouquet of simple, fragrant flowers, symbolizing everlasting love and fertility was very different than, but evolved from, the bouquet of odiferous garlic, herbs and grains that

The *Unity Candle*, often thought to be a religious "custom" doesn't actually have roots in any specific religion and has been around for a mere 30-40 years. In more recent years,


the symbolism represented by the Unity Candle has evolved: these days, two lives becoming one has been symbolized by the couple combining multi-colored sand into one container, mixing two wines into one— and then sipping the combined wine, or the couple adding dirt to a wedding plant.


It would be remiss of me not to mention that some "customs" are often rooted in culture or religion. A couple who is deeply rooted in their culture(s) or their

religion(s), may select specific, more traditional, customs as a means of paying tribute to their culture or religion. In Hawaii, both bride and groom wear wedding leis to honor their culture and in India, they often wear a floral "crown."

The passing of The Marriage Equality Act in 2011 made *same-sex* marriage legal in New York and I photographed my first *same-sex* ceremony in 2013. Regardless of whether a wedding is same-sex or heterosexual, incorporating traditional wedding customs or evolved customs is still the choice of the couple.

While wedding customs will continue to evolve, the true love and joy witnessed at a wedding, does not— it is a constant; immune to change and for this, I am forever thankful.

MIKE'S FISH TANK FISH TANK FACTS

Some Helpful TANK FACTS. GOLDFISH and tropical fish don't always mix. Goldfish like it cold. 60's or less. Tropicals like it warm, near 80 degrees. Algae eaters are tropical fish and don't always do well in the colder water.

Set your tank up and let it run for 24 hours before adding fish. Only float your bag of fish 5 minutes before adding them to your tank. Floating your fish longer then 5 minutes will accomplish nothing. In fact it's dangerous to float longer than that. The water in the bag heats up the longer you float and the oxygen starts to diminish as it heats up, and it becomes dangerous to your fish.

Ick is the most common fish disease. Looks like salt sprinkled on your fish. It's a stress disease, caused by water too hot or too cold. tapping on the glass of your tank, fish being chased or bullied by other fish, floating your bag of fish too long. Any kind of stress can cause ick. If you see it on your fish, treat immediately with an ick remedy. If you catch it in time, you should be able to cure your fish before it can kill your fish.

Some fish are more susceptible to catching ick, bala sharks, clown loaches, iridescent sharks, silver dollars, and rummynose are a few of the fish that catch ick easily. If you have any of these, check your fish over daily. The faster you treat, the better.

Any fish can be a bully. Even community fish can be a problem I have had people tell me their female guppy was bullying their fish. Check your fish daily, if you see a lot of fish with torn or frayed fins, you may have a bully. The fish that has no frayed fins, That's probably your culprit.

Whenever buying fish on a really hot or really cold day, take them right home and put them into your tank. Extreme temperatures can cause problems with your fish.




