



AN INVITATION TO THE TOWN OF GROTON BICENTENNIAL

THE TOWN OF GROTON IS celebrating its 200th Anniversary. Our town is rich in history, including the fact that for a short time we were called Division when we and Tompkins County were first formed in 1817. From our first settlers, to the booming industries we once had, to the beautiful and comfortable country town that we are today, we have much to remember and commemorate. The Bicentennial Committee has planned events throughout the year and wishes to invite everyone to attend.


The opening ceremony will take place on Friday, April 7, 2017, at 6:30 pm at the Groton High School Auditorium. This is exactly 200 years from the first Town Meeting on April 7, 1817. Following the formal posting of the colors by the Groton American Legion, speakers will include Senator James Seward, Assemblywoman Barbara Lifton, County Legislators Michael Lane and Glenn Morey, and several others. After the short program, and music provided by the Groton School bands, a reception will be held with light refreshments. Admission is free.

Also in April (date yet to be announced at the writing of this article) Tompkins County will be installing a special historical marking in front of the Groton Town Hall at 101 Conger Boulevard, Groton. There will be a short program and an ice-cream social, open to the public and free of charge.

A completely new and different community event called "Treasures of Groton's Past" will be held on Saturday, June 10, 2017 beginning at 10:00 am, on Conger Boulevard in Groton. At first glance this might look like a flea market, but it's not because no "treasures" will be for sale. It will be more like a giant "show and tell" where everyone will be encouraged to display their special items related to Groton, such as old photos, memorabilia, diaries, family heirlooms, antiques, signs, odd items that no one knows what they are, and most of all, their stories. We are seeking to put on view "Groton Treasures" that the owners will never part with, but the rest of us would like to see and enjoy. In addition to the very personal displays that we are asking people to share, there will be exhibits of toy trains, toy farm machinery, antique dolls, sleds, cars, tractors, buggies, and sleighs. There will be horse drawn-wagon rides, music, entertainment, a kids scavenger hunt, other activities for kids, and fun for all ages. The concession stand will be provided by Foggy Bog Hunting Camp, whose members have become famous for their awesome food. The day will be topped off with an "antique parade" organized by the Groton Fire Department. There is no charge to set up a display and anyone interested should contact the Town Clerk's Office at 607-898-5035 no later than June 1, 2017.

Starting on July 11th and running through August 1st, the McLean Community Council will be presenting their Mystery/History Programs every Tuesday at 7:00 pm at the McLean Fire Stations. Once the McLean Community Council finishes their programs the Bicentennial Committee will continue the Mystery/ History Programs through August and into September. JUNE IS NATIONAL DAIRY MONTH and for many decades Cortland County has celebrated its largest industry with a parade unlike any other in the county.





The ladies auxiliary will have their fabulous homemade donuts on sale at the community hall. Please stop by and try them.



FRENCH DISTILLERS & ALCHEMISTS (FDA) OPENS DOORS

10 Walker Ave. Lisle, NY 13797

A New CRAFT DISTILLERY IS open at the head of the Finger Lakes Winery, Brewery, and Distillery Trail. Newly built, French Distillers & Alchemists (FDA) includes a still-house, rack house and tasting room. Located at 10 Walker Avenue in Lisle, New York, the distillery is just off NY State Route 79. FDA, notably, is the first distillery to open in Broome County since the end of the 1920-1933 Prohibition Era.

FDA is the brain child of native son Phil French, who one might say has simply expanded a family legacy. Published in 1651, "The Art of Distillation" was authored by family member John French. This was the first how-to book on the subject available in the English language. In the early 1800's, Dr. Selphonious French, another family member, settled the land now occupied by FDA. Today, Phil's son and brother are key crew members at FDA.

Phil teamed up with long time friend and fellow entrepreneur Larry Berger to learn the art and create the business. It took a few years to complete the training, the plan, and to build and equip the facility. Contrary to popular belief, it is still illegal to distill without a Federal License, but by January 2016, all State and Federal Licenses were in place and production was underway. The tasting room opened the following May.

Dedicated to making small batch, hand-crafted whiskeys, FDA uses locally grown grains including corn, rye, wheat and malted barley. The crew carries out the entire small batch process of mashing, distilling, aging, and bottling. Mash



is cooked and fermented before being distilled. This produces "low wines," which are then distilled a second time. This double-distilling technique allows for tight cuts which separate the fore shots, heads, hearts, and tails ensuring that the hearts are very clean. The hearts are then aged in oak barrels until ready for bottling. The spirits are then ready to sample and buy in the tasting room. FDA products are increasingly available in a growing number of area liquor stores, as well.

"Lilah's Lightning" is a young whiskey made from a bourbon mash. The grain bill of corn, wheat and malted barley is aged for a short time to yield a 100 proof spirit that is surprisingly sweet with a smooth finish. The "Village Idiot" is a young whiskey made from a rye mash (rye and malted barley) and this, too, is a wonder. At 90 proof, it starts sweet and finishes with a gentle spiciness. Soon, FDA will crack open their first fully-aged barrels and release a wheat whiskey and a bourbon then followed in the summer by a rye.

FDA is open every day of the week, from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m.. You can visit, sample, purchase, and view the art of the process at the French Distillers & Alchemists Still-House and Tasting Room, 10 Walker Ave, Village of Lisle, NY.
