**BLOOMIN' CUP BLOSSOMS IN TULLY**

PON ENTERING THE BLOOMIN' CUP Coffee House in Tully, NY, a patron gets a sense of warmth and cleanliness. Decorated in whites and pastel buttercup yellows, the tables and chairs give an impression of a spacious, homey kitchen where children would gather to help their mom bake cookies, or where friends might reunite to catch up with each others' lives. A comfy sofa and chairs surround a fireplace, a picturesque setting which invites visions of relaxing in front of a crackling fire with a cup of hot cocoa while snow falls outside.

Bloomin' Cup offers a wide array of food, from New York style bagels to soups, salads, and pan-i-nis. And of course, there are a variety of hot and cold coffee drinks, from regular coffee to chai lattes and hot cocoa to iced coffee and frappes.

While Bloomin' Cup has operated in Tully, for about 2-1/2 years, it was just recently planted at its current location at 13 Clinton Street about five months ago. Originally located in the Tully Artworks building, Bloomin' Cup faced some challenges in the form of very little parking for customers and an air of invisibility that made it difficult for potential patrons to find. Yearning for additional space, parking, and a more visible presence, Melissa Flint-Morgan, owner of Bloomin' Cup, made the move to the brand-new building in May of this year.

Bloomin' Cup faced a new set of challenges during in its new digs. The fresh start has been a learning experience for Melissa, who has worked hard to smooth out the bumpy road that comes with a business expansion. "This has been a process of trial and error," she said. "Operating out of a small kitchen and offering all of our own homemade soups, salads and baked goods is all new to me. I've learned a lot by asking questions of individuals with knowledge of this kind of business."

Melissa's love of coffee developed when she was an undergrad and worked in a coffee shop in the Jewish Community Center in Rochester, NY. "I loved work, my co-workers, and the coffee. I was happy to get up and go to work every morning." Though she has a Master's Degree in teaching and curriculum, Melissa's passion for coffee and the camaraderie the beverage engenders prevailed. "I came back to coffee because I believe it brings people together. You can see people gathering together here over a cup of coffee or a bowl of soup . . . it just brings the community together." Tully didn't have a coffee shop or a business that had the right atmosphere as a gathering place, so she set out to create one.

Moving Bloomin' Cup has allowed Melissa to not only refresh her business, but to start over from scratch and expand. With everything brand-new, from the freshly





paved parking lot to her new kitchen and staff, she has had the opportunity to try different ways to realize her vision. "I wanted to create an environment of inclusiveness, where people of all ages and walks of life are welcome, rather than catering to a specific demographic," she said. "I have carried that principle through with my staff, as well. I have a great staff. They are kind, dedicated, and they understand my mission."

Melissa is able to breathe a bit easier now as Bloomin' Cup is running beginning to run smoothly. She will be expanding the coffee house just a bit further during the winter months, with plans to enclose the outdoor covered patio with glass panels and add space heaters, so that patrons of Bloomin' Cup can sit outside and be warm as they watch the snow fall.

Currently, Bloomin' Cup is partnering with Kowbell Farms to hold a pumpkin carving contest. All you need to do is stop inside and register as a participant, and you can pick up a free pumpkin! Take it home, carve it, and bring it back. Ballots will be provided so that everyone can vote for their favorite pumpkin!

Bloomin' Cup is an excellent place to check out - especially now that the fall chill has set in! If you are out and about and looking to warm up a bit, stop in at 13 Clinton Street, Tully, grab a hot coffee beverage and a snack and get cozy! ### CREATURE FEATURE BLUE JAY

WHILE MOST EVERYONE RECOGNIZES THE Blue Jay with its sky blue feathers, black "necklace" and jaunty head crest, here are some fun facts you may not know about this feisty bird.

> • They're not actually blue! Due to the structure of their feathers, light is distorted, making them appear blue. They're really

brown!

- Blue Jays produce many calls and will mimic the screech of a red-tailed hawk, perhaps to scare away other birds from a food source. They also communicate through body language, like raising and lowering their crest.
- They are curious and intelligent, form close family bonds and often mate for life.
- Some individuals choose to migrate, but many remain year-round.
- Blue Jays have a throat pouch they fill with favorite foods, like acorns, to cache and eat later. Acorns are often buried, and jays are credited with the spread of oak trees.
- They sometimes wipe ants across their feathers; this is known as "anting." It's believed they do this to make the ants secrete noxious spray, after which they are fit to eat.
- Attract Blue Jays to your yard by providing tray feeders filled with peanuts and sunflower seeds, as well as offering suet. Planting a new tree or two? Consider oaks!
- The oldest known wild Blue Jay lived to be around 17-1/2 years old.



#### **TODAY IS ALL THAT MATTERS** BREATHING PRACTICE FOR ANXIETY RELIEF

 $2^{\rm weeks}$  ago, I shared about some of the reasons why yoga is beneficial.

Yoga is a physical practice that has mental and emotional benefits some of which help relieve the sensations of anxiety. While this may be a great benefit for those who like yoga, others haven't tried yoga. Totally OK!

What if there was a simple technique from the science of yoga that didn't require any time on a yoga mat, that you can do anywhere, anytime?

Before we get to it, though, a quick recap of what anxiety actually is, as we understand it at Yoga Farm:

"Anxiety occurs as rapid or racing thoughts that we are believing true, leading to feelings of worry, nervousness or unease about something, a future event or uncertain outcome." — Definition by Daniela Hess

One way to soothe sensations of anxiety is with a breathing practice designed to soothe the vagus nerve - a large nerve that connects your brain to the heart, lungs and digestion. When the vagus nerve is soothed, our nervous system is in the 'rest and relax' mode instead of 'fight or flight' mode.

Sound good? Give this a try now:

First, become aware of your body, feel your feet, your hips, hands and shoulders.

Next, breathe deeply into your lower abdomen, then, as you breathe out, take longer to breathe out than you did to breathe in.

It also helps to count the breath. For example, when you breathe in, count to 4, when you breathe out, count to 8.

Try it now, for one minute. Then, notice how you feel.

### MIKE'S FISH TANK GLOFISH

**G**LOFISH ARE ALL THE RAGE now. Very popular fish. They started out as zebra danios but now there are glo barbs, glo tetras and glo sharks. Right now the glo sharks just come in 2 colors, yellow and purple. The glo barbs just come in red and green. The glo danios and glo tetras come in 6 colors, red yellow, green, orange, purple and blue. The blue are not very vibrant. All other colors are very striking. A lot of people think glo fish are painted or injected with dye. They are not. Glofish have been engineered through DNA to be colorful and the color will not fade or go away. The fluorescent color in GloFish is produced by an inherited fluorescent protein gene that is passed from generation to generation and creates the beautiful fluorescence that can be seen

when looking at the fish. The fluorescent protein genes are derived from naturally occurring genes found in marine organisms.

In general, GloFish prefer temperatures of 75-80°f. The most important thing to remember is to avoid quick temperature changes, since these can cause ick and other fish diseases.

GloFish are relatively hardy, easy to keep, and get along well with other fish.

If you have other fish in your tank or are adding new fish to your GloFish tank, be careful to choose fish that can all live together in a similar environment. Here are a few key points that may be helpful: Like their non-fluorescent counterparts, GloFish are schooling fish and should ideally be kept in groups. Glofish like filtered water, so a filter and heater is important for your glofish to do well.

Be sure not to crowd too many fish into a tank. Please avoid keeping fish (even just one glofish) in a small bowl.

Betta fish do the best in small bowls. Glofish will do best in a filtered, heated tank.

GloFish fluorescent fish thrive in all types of settings, including homes, offices, and classrooms.

### HALLOWEEN: TOP 10 SAFETY TIPS FOR PET PARENTS

A TTENTION, ANIMAL LOVERS, IT'S ALMOST the spookiest night of the year!

Keep your pet safe with these simple tips.

1. No tricks, no treats: That bowl of candy is for trickor-treaters, not for Scruffy and Fluffy. Chocolate in all forms—especially dark or baking chocolate—can be very dangerous for dogs and cats. Candies containing the artificial sweetener xylitol can also cause problems. If you do suspect your pet has ingested something toxic, please call your veterinarian or the ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center at (888) 426-4435.

2. Popular Halloween plants such as pumpkins and decorative corn are considered to be relatively nontoxic, but they can produce stomach upset in pets who nibble on them.

3. Wires and cords from electric lights and other decorations should be kept out of reach of your pets. If chewed, your pet might suffer cuts or burns, or receive a possibly life-threatening electrical shock.

4. A carved pumpkin certainly is festive, but use caution if you choose to add a candle. Pets can easily knock a lit pumpkin over and cause a fire. Curious kittens especially run the risk of getting burned or singed by candle flames.

5. Dress-up can be a big mess-up for some pets. Please don't put your dog or cat in a costume UNLESS you know he or she loves it (yup, a few pets are real hams!). For pets who prefer their "birthday suits," however, wearing a costume may cause undue stress.

6. If you do dress up your pet, make sure the costume isn't annoving or unsafe. It should not constrict the animal's movement or hearing, or impede his ability to breathe, bark or meow. Also, be sure to try on costumes before the big night. If your pet seems distressed, allergic or shows abnormal behavior, consider letting him go au naturale or donning a festive bandana.

7. Take a closer look at your pet's costume and make sure it does not have small, dangling or easily chewed-off pieces that he could choke on. Also, ill-fitting outfits can get twisted on external objects or your pet, leading to injury.

8. All but the most social dogs and cats should be kept in a separate room away from the front door during peak trick-or-treating hours. Too many strangers can be scary and stressful for pets.







### **DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME ENDS**

TIME WILL FALL BACK TO standard time again on Sunday. November 4 at 2am, when daylight saving time ends. History of Daylight Time in the U.S. Although standard time in time zones was instituted in the U.S. and Canada by the railroads in 1883, it was not established in U.S. law until the Act of March 19, 1918, sometimes called the Standard Time Act. The act also established daylight saving time, a contentious idea then. Daylight saving time was repealed in 1919, but standard time in time zones remained in law. Daylight time became a local matter. It was re-established nationally early in World War II, and was continuously observed from 9 February 1942 to 30 September 1945. After the war its use varied among states and localities. The Uniform Time Act of 1966 provided standardization in the dates of beginning and end of daylight time in the U.S. but allowed for local exemptions from its observance. The act provided that daylight time begin on the last Sunday in April and end on the last Sunday in October, with the changeover to occur at 2 a.m. local time. During the "energy crisis" years, Congress enacted earlier starting dates for daylight time. In 1974, daylight time began on 6 January and in 1975 it began on 23 February. After those two years the starting date reverted back to the last Sunday in April. In 1986, a law was passed that shifted the starting date of daylight time to the first Sunday in April, beginning in 1987. The ending date of daylight time was not subject to such changes, and remained the last Sunday in October. The Energy Policy Act of 2005 changed

both the starting and ending dates. Beginning in 2007, daylight time started on the second Sunday in March and ends on the first Sunday in November.




