

MIKE'S FISH TANK GOLDFISH

THERE ARE QUITE A FEW types of goldfish. Some of the most lacksquare popular are the red ryukins, red and white ryukins, The orandas, which are the ones with the big forehead when they get bigger. They come in an assortment of colors, such as: red caps, calico, red, red and black, red and white. The telescopes have the big eyes and come in black, red and calico. The pearlscale goldfish are popular for their big rounded stomachs. They have raised bumps all over their body.

The lionhead and celestial goldfish are not as popular. Celestials have big eyes pointed upwards, like looking to the celestial bodies in the sky, thus their name, celestials. The lionhead are missing the top fin so makes them a unique looking goldfish.

Then you have the goldfish which do ok in ponds or inside tanks, things like sarasa comets, shubunkins, regular comets and koi. Of course koi come in so many colors and are super popular in ponds. Shubunkins are the calico version of pond fish. Regular comets are like the fish you win at the fair or what are sometimes called feeder fish. They come in an assortment of colors and can go in ponds or tanks.

Goldfish like cold water. I do get people who want to mix goldfish and tropical fish. It is hard to say how this will work out. Tropicals like warm water and goldfish like cold water. Goldfish can get sick if the water too warm.

Feed goldfish at least 3 times a day. Also goldfish do not do very good in bowls or really small tanks. They like bigger tanks with lots of filtration and room to swim. They tend to be dirty fish and mess up bowls or small tanks fast. I always say do not put goldfish in anything smaller than a 10 gallon tank.





CREATURE FEATURE WOOD FROGS IN WINTER

THE LITTLE WOOD FROG BURROWS down beneath leaf litter ▲ on the forest floor as the cold weather arrives. There, it enters a state of "suspended animation" to endure the cold winter ahead. Its heart will stop beating, respiration ceases and the kidneys shut down. It literally freezes from the outside in; but because its body produces a glucose-based antifreeze, its organs remain protected, and its cells won't dry out. In the spring, the wood frog thaws out and awakens. Incredible nature!




