MIKE'S STORY MICRODING IS A GIFT; PARENTS GIVE TO THEIR CHILDREN

T WAS A COLD DAY in March, and the Finger Lakes Microd Club was showing some of our microd's at the Binghamton NY Race Show. I was at our club's booth talking to people, answering their questions, when I noticed a lady staring up at our club's banner. May I answer a question for you, I asked? She told me she was interested for her son Mike. I proceeded to tell her how she could rent a Microd (\$100.00) & Club motor (\$85.00) for the season. And that Girls & Boys ages 5 to 17 could race. Then I told her how everything together, the season would cost them less then (\$480.00). Mike's mother signed him up for a try-out appointment, that day before she left our booth. The day for Mike's try-out arrived, and I got my first look at Mike, He was 8 or 9 at the time. One thing you'd notice about Mike was he limped, he had hurt his ankle and wore a brace on it, to help him walk. It was Mike's turn to tryout; he did well, followed the instructions and handled the microd without any problems. They decided to sign-up for the season, they paid, and then picked out microd #37, this would be the microd Mike would drive for the season.

(Special note: One of our club's goals is to always be willing to accommodate the Physically & Mentally Challenged, or people with other special needs.)(The changes that Mike needed to drive the microd were very minor)

When the season started Mike came with his Grandpa (His Mother's Father) who would be his Pit Person, (The person) that put his motor on & off, checked air pressure and generally helped get the microd ready to race each week. Mike started a little slow, but showed steady improvement, he won 4 or 5 races during the first 10 race days of the season. At the end of that 10th week Mike's Grandpa came up to me and said: "The agreement we signed said we needed to come to 11 races right" (Something the club required back then) I replied "Yes". He stated that after the next race (Race 11) "they would not be coming". When I asked why, he said, " My grandson does not appreciate what I am doing for him". It would be years before I saw Mike again, after that 11th race in 1998. When we did meet Mike again, he was a tall young man in his 20's. He stopped by our booth at ironically the Binghamton NY Race Show. As we started talking with Mike he shared with me how grateful he was to have gotten the chance to race a microd, and that he felt the summer of 1998 had been the best year of his life to that





point! Some food for thought: How many 8 or 9 year olds know how or have been taught how to show appreciation? Many times it's not until we get older in our 20's that we start to look back to reflect how we got here, only then do we start to appreciate those who helped us along the way. I only wished his Grandpa could have been there to hear how much it meant to him years later, when I inquired about his Grandpa, Mike replied he had passed quite a few years before. The Best Year of Mike's life could not have happened without Mike's Grandpa, it was the "Gift" of his time that made that summer possible for Mike. The Finger Lakes Microd Club can provide the opportunity, a microd to use, friends to race with, and the place to race. Without the support of the Families, memories' like Mike's don't happen. 

A BROCKWAY TRUCK SHOW WAS BORN...

IN THE YEAR 1999, THE City of Cortland was preparing to celebrate their Centennial year in 2000. They were looking to highlight a business that had made a significant impact on the local area through economy and culture. The Brockway Truck Company

came to mind. Those gleaming Huskies that had sat so proudly on the hoods of the trucks, had given Cortland the nickname of Huskietown, USA. The question then became, how do we get those Huskies back home? The answer was a Brockway Truck Show.

The next question was, how do we make it happen? How do we get the word out there? The research began. Searching through truck publications for other truck shows in the area, one was found in Ballston Spa, NY. It was decided what better way to see what a truck show was all about than to attend one.

So, on a sunny day in the summer of 1999, Shirley Randolph, a Downtown Cortland retailer and member of the Centennial committee, along with her husband, Bob and a couple of friends, visited their first truck show. This visit provided a wealth of information and even more importantly answered the big question of, would people come? The answer was an overwhelming YES! Armed with suggestions and advice on how to run a truck show and contact information of Brockway truck owners who would be interested in a show, they returned to Cortland with their new found information ready to take on the task of planning a Brockway Truck Show.

The Brockway Truck Show Planning Committee, co-chaired by Shirley Randolph and Vicky Delaney, another Downtown Cortland retailer, became part of the City of Cortland Centennial Committee. Other local Brockway truck owners became part of the Planning Committee including a former Brockway employee by the name of John Potter. Two members of the Twin Tier Chapter of the Antique Truck Historical Society in the Binghamton area, Walter Carmon and Robert Messersmith, became actively involved in the



Truck Show planning. It was decided that a one-time Brockway Truck Show would be held the second Saturday in August.

The Cortland County Jr. Fairgrounds was chosen as the staging grounds since it afforded the space needed and was close to Downtown Cortland. A parade seemed like the best idea to move the historical trucks to Main Street, approximately one mile away and just a few blocks from where the trucks were originally built. On that second Saturday of August in 2000, the Brockway trucks started rolling into the fairgrounds parking lot to form the parade which brought 76 trucks from six states to Main Street in Cortland, NY. What a day it was!! Stories were shared, Brockway trucks were verbally re-built and a reunion of former Brockway employees took place. As people were leaving and the trucks and their owners returned to the fairgrounds for a chicken barbeque, we kept hearing "we will see you next year". That was the beginning of the Annual Brockway Truck Show.

By 2003, the now Annual Brockway Truck Show had gained National recognition with Brockway enthusiasts attending from two countries and ten states. The number of registered trucks continued to grow and thousands of spectators were still drawn to Main Street. And this was the year the decision was made to recognize former Brockway employees; a committee was formed to collect names and addresses and they were invited to be our guest at a luncheon at the Community Restaurant, Downtown Cortland, NY.

As the attention to the event grew, so did the desire to bring Brockway trucks back to the Cortland area for more than just one day each year. The Brockway Truck Show Committee decided that it was time to take a giant step forward to bring the Brockway trucks back to Cortland permanently. This had been a dream of John Potter and several others from the original show committee since the very first truck show. At the 2003, Truck Show, the Committee announced a goal of forming a Brockway Museum in Cortland, NY. Turning Dreams Into Reality.....

From the first Brockway Truck Show, held in August 2000, the Truck Show Committee dreamed about the possibility of creating a Brockway museum where Brockway trucks would be on display year-round, along with the wealth of memorabilia and history of the manufacturing, selling, service and use of the trucks. In 2005, the Show Committee became Brockway Truck Show, Inc., a nonprofit organization to manage the annual truck show. On February 9, 2006, the dream became a reality when Peter Grimm of Troy, NY, a Brockway enthusiast, made a very generous contribution. This enabled the Brockway Truck Show, Inc. to purchase the A.B. Brown property on Route 11 in Cortlandville, NY. There was a lot of work to be done and many hours of volunteer labor was logged.

Changes were happening. The 9th Annual Brockway Truck Show opened with a two-day Show and the location was changed from the Cortland County Jr. Fairgrounds to the future Brockway Truck Museum. The Show would begin on Friday with a fundraiser dinner in the evening and the parade would leave the museum site on Saturday morning. In 2009, fireworks were added to the Friday evening event. In 2010, the former Brockway employee recognition was moved to the Saturday evening chicken barbeque held at the museum site where they continued to be our guests.

In 2011, the 12th Annual Brockway Truck Show was transformed into a four-day Show. The Huskie Drive was introduced that year as a Thursday afternoon outing. Planned and led by Hugh Riehlman, trucks and their owners were lined up for a country drive to a surprise location for lunch and back to the Museum site. The usual festivities continued on Friday and Saturday with the addition of a pancake breakfast on Sunday morning.

The year 2012 was a very big year historically. The original Brockway Motor Truck Company, started by George A. Brockway, celebrated its 100th Anniversary. June 8, 2012 marked the 35th Anniversary of the last truck to be built by Brockway (in Miami, FL on 6/8/1977).

On June 8, 2012, the ribbon cutting ceremony was held for the Grand Opening of the Brockway Museum at the Central New York Living History Center. The dream had come full circle. Unfortunately, we lost some of our dreamers along the way, including John Potter, while we gained some new folks to help continue the dream. The Children's Corner in the Brockway Museum is dedicated in John's memory (4/28/39 - 9/14/2003).

The 13th Annual National Brockway Truck Show held in August 2012 had a record attendance of 154 registered trucks and owners coming from 24 states and two countries (Canada and Australia).

This year marks the 20th Annual National Brockway Truck Show, Aug. 8-11, 2019. Let's see if we can set a new attendance record. We will have a few Brockway owners who will be receiving their 20 year pins. The Delaney Bros. Blue Grass Band will perform on Main Street from Noon to 3 p.m. Awards will be presented at 3 p.m. Looking forward to our next milestone.....the 25th!

2020 was a crazy year for everyone and the Truck Show didn't go on as planned. This year marks the 21st Annual National Brockway Truck Show, Aug. 12-15, 2021. Let's see if we can set a new attendance record. Awards will be presented at 3 p.m. Looking forward to our next milestone.....the 25th!

CREATURE FEATURE GYPSY MOTH INVASION

The gypsy moth is an *invasive species*, not native to the U.S. ⊥ It hails from Europe and first arrived in Massachusetts in 1869. The gypsy moth caterpillar has a ravenous appetite, feeding on over 300 species of trees and shrubs. As it gorges itself it defoliates trees to where some cannot recover, posing a significant threat to our forests. Entire swaths of woodlands can be stripped bare in a single season; and in consecutive infestation years, the outcome can be devastating. Early detection is crucial to controlling the spread of this damaging pest.

Adult gypsy moths are emerging from their pupa/chrysalis stage now. Females are large and white with wavy, tan stripes on their flightless wings. Male moths are smaller and light brown; they locate females by following their pheromone scent. After breeding, the female lays between 600-1,000 eggs within a beige, silk sac directly onto tree bark, fence posts, etc.

Using a flat-edged knife or paint scraper, carefully scrape the egg sacs into a container of soapy water and soak two days before discarding in the trash. Never simply scrape them onto the ground; they will still hatch next spring! YouTube has some instructional videos with good tips.

Garden centers sell gypsy moth pheromone traps you can place to capture male moths. Next spring, consider spraying with a safe, natural-based product called BTK that effectively attacks growing caterpillars.

Together, they built a large and beautiful home which eventually became the hospital in the city of Cortland. ITHACA DIRT RIDERS SPRINT ENDURO SUNDAY, AUGUST 22


IN THE EARLY 1970'S, A small group of local off-road motorcycle enthusiasts came together to form the Ithaca Dirt Riders (IDR). It was their vision to provide some local trails and events for their club members and other to enjoy. A year later, the club chartered with the American Motorcyclist Association (AMA). With many of its member interested in the AMA sport of enduros, the club sanctioned its first event. This year is the 48th anniversary of The Ithaca Dirt Riders Enduro! It will be held on Sunday, August 22 at 253 Andersen Hill Road, Berkshire, NY 13736 starting at 9:00 am. The sprint enduro consists of three "loops" through fields and woods. It is a great experience for riders with a good deal of challenge for them also and riders can ride as young as 12 years old, if they have a bike with at least a 19" front tire. There are NO spectator fees and we have information sheets available to see where the riders will be during the event. Find out more about these events at <u>amad4enduro.com</u> or <u>ecea.org</u> or on Facebook, look for "AMA District 4 Enduro Championship" or "East Coast Enduro Association" for event information.

SO, WHAT IS AN ENDURO? Enduros are a cross-country event, which not only requires speed and ability, but also endurance, (hence "Enduro"). With a standard enduro, a rider must also stay on time. A route is laid out for the riders to follow and a speed is set for them to maintain. Small groups of riders, (usually four), are started every minute. The rider must then try to maintain the speed scheduled for any given area. To score the riders, the promoter has secret "check points" along the route. If he/she is not on time, they are given 1 point for every minute they are late. Being early is much worse, with 2 points for the first 2 minutes that you are early and 5 points for every minute earlier than that and disqualification if you are more than 15 minutes early. Like golf, at the end of the event the scores are added up and the rider with the lowest score wins.

With a Sprint Enduro, the timekeeping element is not a factor. Fairly new to the enduro world in America, sprint enduros allow competitors to race against the clock on wide, fast-flowing trails and grass track. They ride a small number of special tests multiple times throughout the day, trying to improve their times each ride. There is a time limitation to complete the required test section or tests. The rider with the fastest time to complete the loops wins.

With the help of many volunteers and supporters, the Ithaca Dirt Riders have not only been able to host this local event, but many AMA national events over the years. IDR not only promote the sport of off-road riding, but also help the local communities, especially the local volunteer fire departments and emergency squads in the past, who provide great meals at the events, along with their services when necessary.

MIKE'S FISH TANK CORY CATS

NORYDORAS OTHERWISE KNOWN AS CORYS is by far the largest genus of Neotropical fishes with almost 142 species Several hundred corydoras species are not yet classified but are kept by aquarists. Corys are distributed east of the Andes to the Atlantic coast, from Trinidad to the Rio de la Plata in northern Argentina. Corys are also found in South America in a variety of environments. Corys are well known among aquarists and are hugely popular. They are well suited to tropical community aquariums as they get along well with other species and are not aggressive at all. Many types of corys are actually quite timid. Corys are mostly bottom dwellers, so it's a good idea to offer them sinking foods such as shrimp pellets and other tropical pellets. If you do flake foods, just be sure that some gets to the bottom for the slower more shy corys. Remember, Corys will not eat any uneaten food that sits down at the bottom of your tank. That you need to siphon out.

Corys can tolerate a wide range of water conditions, including temperatures that are cooler than Tropical. They do not do well in tanks with high Nitrate levels. So be sure that you do your monthly water changes which will get rid of any high nitrates. Corydoras are fairly easy to keep, being peaceful hardy, active, and entertaining. Occasionally they will dart to the surface, sticking their snout above the water to take a breath of air. This behavior is perfectly normal and is not an indication of anything wrong. The corys longevity in the aquarium is noteworthy.

There are cases of corys living to 27 years in captivity and 20 years are not uncommon. In the wild, corys are generally found in smaller streams and along the margins of larger rivers, in marshes and ponds.

Cory cats are an excellent addition to your freshwater fish tank.


