

LOCAL GROUP HOLDS YOUTH **VIDEO CONTEST ABOUT IMPACT OF SMOKING IN MOVIES**

The more young people see smoking on screen, the more likely they are to start smoking

▼ortland/Tompkins/Chenango Reality Check, a program Cof the Cortland County Health Department, invites youth ages 13-18 to participate in a contest aimed at shining a spotlight on the tobacco industry's use of smoking imagery on screen to normalize and glamorize tobacco use. The statewide winning video will be highlighted on the Reality Check and Tobacco-Free NY websites and promoted through social media.

The University of California San Francisco's Smoke-Free Media ``What is Hollywood Hiding from Parents Action Toolkit'explains, "Big Tobacco secretly bought its way on screen for decades. The U.S. entertainment industry still refuses to give parents and audiences advance warning before exposing kids to tobacco imagery that is proven to recruit millions of new young smokers and kill them as adults. Tobacco on screen is the single biggest media risk to children and teens. Hollywood has known of the danger since at least 2003. Yet movie studios and TV producers have never updated their rating systems to even mention smoking or tobacco. They are concealing toxic content. Ratings, warnings, and TV parental controls all need to be reinforced to stop tobacco addiction from trapping another generation. With the streaming revolution now underway, it's easier than ever for kids to watch movies and TV shows packed with toxic tobacco content. And, the more young people see smoking on screen, the more likely they are to start smoking."

"This video competition gives young people across New York the opportunity to become involved in a Reality Check priority initiative.," explains Kristina Donders, Reality Check Youth Ambassador of the Year for 2021. "It is projected that on-screen smoking will kill two million U.S. Children and teens alive today. This is a campaign that saves lives. We are looking forward to seeing what youth have to say about this in their videos."

Teens throughout the region and the state are challenged to create a 60-second video exposing the tobacco industry's manipulative tactics within the entertainment industry. Tobacco imagery is used to promote and glamorize smoking and e-cigarette use. Judging will be based on quality, creativity and effectiveness, and accuracy of messages. Each video must have the following key facts and a minimum of one key statement from the following:

Key Facts:

Youth who are exposed to images of smoking in movies are more likely to smoke. (US Surgeon General)

It is projected that on-screen smoking will kill two million U.S. children and teens alive today. (US Center for Disease Control)

R-rating future movies with smoking would reduce the youth smoking rate in the United States by 18%. (US Center for Disease Control)

Key Statements:

One little letter could save a million lives. Rate smoking R.

Protect youth from on-screen exposure to tobacco.

Smoking in movies kills in real life.

Video submissions are due February 9, 2022. One video will be recognized as the statewide winner. This video will live on www.realitycheckofny.com and highlight the issue through the lens of New York State youth. Four regional winning videos will also be awarded and recognized at the regional level. All winners will be announced on March 9, 2022 as part of the New York Tobacco Control Program's annual Statewide Legislative Education Day. All awards will be recognized at regional press events (dates and locations to be determined) and promoted through local media outlets. All youth participating in the contest will receive a Reality Check Swag Bag.

CREATURE FEATURE TINY BUT TOUGH

The black-capped chickadee is a wee winter warrior. It L weighs about as much as a handful of paperclips but can survive frigid temperatures thanks to some amazing adaptations. For starters, its plush winter plumage helps trap body heat and keep out the cold. The chickadee is also choosy about where it sleeps, preferring a well-insulated roosting nook.

During a typical winter day, the black-capped chickadee revisits many different places where it hid seeds previously, tucked one by one under tree bark or in tree crotches. It finds its hidden stashes thanks to a remarkable capacity for memory that actually increases during the winter months.

In addition to seeds, the chickadee also eats berries, insects and their eggs and larvae, and occasionally bits of carrion. It gorges itself, gaining an additional 10 percent or more of its body weight each day before going to roost. During a long, cold winter night, the chickadee endures hypothermia and a reduced metabolic rate. It shivers to generate heat, and by the next morning, the excess fat it consumed the day before is burned off.

Despite common belief, feeding chickadees doesn't make them dependent on us. They relish black-oil sunflower seeds, suet and peanut butter, and these high-fat offerings can give them a much-needed boost during severe cold.

This is the time of year where people set up new fish tanks or redo tanks they have had awhile.

I get a lot of the same questions about tanks, so for all the new people, here are some helpful hints for a newly set up aquarium.

For warm water fish, let your tank run at least 48 hours to be sure your heater is keeping your water temperature stable.

Fish don't like up and down temps. 78 or 79 degrees is perfect.

Only add a few fish the first 4 to 5 weeks. There is a good bacteria that has to grow. Normally 3 to 4 small fish in a new 10 gallon, 5 to 6 small fish in a new 20 gallon, 6 to 7 fish in a new 30 gallon, and so on.

Your tank may get cloudy on week 3 or 4 but it's normal and will go away as your good bacteria grows more.

When you get home, only float your bag of fish for 3 to 5 minutes. Floating too long can kill them. Always take your fish straight home, the quicker they get out of the bag, the better.

Wait on an algae eater, there is no algae in a new tank.

Goldfish like cold water and tropical fish like warm water, so if you want to mix them, you'll just have to see how it goes. It doesn't always work.

Be sure to siphon water from the bottom of your tank once a month. That way, you can get rid of waste or old food that settles to the bottom.

Feed your fish 3 times a day. Feed just small amounts. Too much food will cause your water to get cloudy.

On hot days and cold days, take your fish right home after you buy them. They will do bad if they get too hot or too cold.





CORTLAND COUNTY TRIVIA FROM THE CORTLAND COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

T^N THE LAST ISSUE OF the Cortland Area Tribune, we asked if you knew when the Cortland Water Works Company was established. Can you believe it's been around since 1884? Prior to 1884, the people of Cortland Village (not incorporated as a city until 1900) were perfectly happy with their wells and did not see a use for a public water system. Fire protection was one of the factors that necessitated the eventual establishment of the Cortland Water Works. Fire hydrants for fire protection were one of the first orders of business for the newly formed utility.

The Water Works that we know and love evolved over the decades, beginning with a spirit of public service and a commitment to doing more for the community. At various times, the Water Works has been a location for ice skating and for swimming! There has been a petting zoo that included raccoons, deer, swans, and peacocks. Many of the trees were planted in the 1920s and 1930s. At one time there was a lily pond supplied with lily pads from a local nursery. In 1951, there were four deer, all males. The herd has evolved over the years and is managed by Cortland Police Chief Paul Sandy who acts as a volunteer steward of the herd. Former Water Works employee Mike Dexter is the volunteer caregiver of the herd and makes sure they are well fed. The NYS Department of Agriculture has oversight over the deer at the Water Works. The lights at Christmas are an eagerly anticipated tradition that got started in 1949.

The Water Works is an important part of the Cortland community, and you can learn more if you go to our YouTube channel and search under "Lunch & Learn" for the talk given by Mike Dexter.

CORTLAND REPERTORY THEATRE ANNOUNCES 50TH ANNIVERSARY **SUMMER SEASON FOR 2022**

NORTLAND REPERTORY THEATRE, ONE OF New York State's longest running professional summer theatres, is announcing their 50th Anniversary summer season slated for 2022. This celebratory season is currently planned to be held inside the Little York Pavilion in Preble. Kicking off the season from June 8 – 18, CRT presents the groundbreaking rock musical HAIR with book and lyrics by Germone Ragni and James Rado, and music by Galt MacDermot. This American tribal love-rock musical is a celebration of the sixties counterculture with a collection of songs that became top radio hits, including Aquarius, Good Morning Starshine, and Let the Sun Shine. As relevant today as it was then, the musical explores ideas of identity, community, and global responsibility as it examines what it means to be a young person in a changing world. CRT cautions that the show will contain adult language and situations, simulated drug use, brief full nudity and sexually explicit scenes.

Next from June 22 - July 2, CRT revisits one of their most beloved comedies in their 50 years, with a revival of Joe DePietro's OVER THE RIVER AND THROUGH THE WOODS. 
