Another Summer has come and gone, but don't mourn too deeply, as Autumn and Winter are spectacular seasons in our region. Whether you're leaf peeping or picking apples and pumpkins, or enjoying a snowy landscape hiking, skiing or ice fishing, the wonders of nature abound.

As September fades, blue jays announce their presence with brash calls. The last brood of fledgling robins flit about, dining on fruits and late-season insects; a few still wear their speckled baby plumage. Goldenrod grows prolifically along fields and roadsides. It produces a brighter yellow bloom than ragweed and nourishes countless pollinators, while providing predatorial insects a place to hunt.

Come October, watch for ruby-crowned kinglets and palm warblers, both late migrators. Palm warblers forage in dogwoods and other low shrubs along trails and fields, flicking their tails as they go. Hard mast nut crops and fungi of all shapes, sizes and colors feed a plethora of wildlife, like deer, bears, rabbits, hares, opossums, raccoons, chipmunks, mice and many birds. Produced by Halley's Comet dust, the Orionids meteor shower radiates near the constellation Orion. It is slated to peak on October 21 and 22, when shooting stars will streak across the dark sky between midnight and dawn.

November's nakedness allows us glimpses of pileated woodpeckers and red-tailed hawks. Meanwhile, smaller birds like white-breasted nuthatches, chickadees and tufted titmice rove about in mixed flocks. Folks offering a wellstocked bird feeder will enjoy the cheerful activity these winged sprites bring to a dreary day. Graceful white-tailed deer, engaged in the annual rut, are dressed in somber gray winter coats, their silent silhouettes almost ghostlike on foggy mornings.

As Winter takes the reins and deeper snowfalls blanket the ground, a snug quiet envelops the landscape and nature seems subdued; but while some creatures hibernate, many are still actively on the go. A vibrant red fox against the snow is breathtaking to behold. Appreciate the wonder of a colorful fish pulled through a dark hole in the lake ice, or a bald eagle gliding over a stretch of open water. Look for tracks left in the snow by meandering wild turkeys, grouse, deer, foxes, fishers, and squirrels. Their calling cards remind us that life goes on, leading us closer to springtime, one step at a time...

JOSIE'S JOURNEY BRIEF HISTORY ABOUT PET THERAPY

COME OF THE EARLIEST USE OF animals for therapeutic use was in Belgium in the middle ages, where pets and people were rehabilitated together. Pets provided natural therapy for humans.

In the 1940s, the American Red Cross and the Army Air Corps established a farm where recuperating veterans could interact with and take care of animals while they were healing from war injuries and illness. Working with the animals was thought to comfort the recovering veterans, help them forget about the war, and focus on recovery (Fine, 2000).

Dr. Sigmund Freud, used Jo-Fi, his dog, in his clinical practice. Freud believed that Jo-Fi could judge a person's character. Freud believed that having Jo-Fi present during his therapy sessions had a calming influence on his patients, particularly children (Coren/Walker, 1997).

Formal therapeutic work and research was done by Dr. Boris Levinson. In 1961, while working with a withdrawn and mentally impaired young boy, Dr. Levinson made an "accidental discovery" involving his dog, Jingles. Levinson briefly left Jingles alone with the boy and, when he returned, found the young boy interacting with the dog. During further research Levinson found that the presence of a dog during therapy sessions had a positive effect on impaired young patients. Levinson later used the expression "pet therapy" in reference to Jingles' beneficial effects on mentally impaired children in a therapeutic setting (Levinson, 1964).







CORTLAND COUNTY TRIVIA FROM THE CORTLAND COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The Cortland Apple is widely considered one of the best tasting apples ever developed but were you able to figure out when they were introduced?

Cortland apples are a cross between McIntosh and Ben Davis varieties. The apple was developed by Professor S.A. Beach at Cornell University's New York State Agricultural Station in Geneva, NY in 1898. It was introduced to the public in 1915 and quickly became a favorite. The McIntosh apple lends its sweetness, and the Ben Davis variety gives its cold hardiness to the Cortland apple. Cortland apples are the 12th most commonly produced apple in the United States. Nearby Cortland County contributed a name to the new variety.

LOT OF PEOPLE ASK me what fish get along with A LOT OF PEOPLE ASK INC. tetras, dwarf gouramis, mollies, platies, cory cats, swordtails, guppies, rasboras, danios, plecos and most of the barbs are usually good community fish. A lot of the barbs, bigger gouramis, sharks and some loaches can be more aggressive. The redtail sharks are the most aggressive, although sometimes they are fine. The Bala, tricolor and Iridescent sharks are the most community. Of the barbs, the tiger barbs are the worst as far as aggressiveness, but things like the gold barb, green tiger barb, and the checkered barbs are usually fairly community. The only danio that can be a little nippy are the giant danios. The rainbowfish are almost always community and they like to school, so they look nice when there are several in a tank. Some of the bigger catfish, like the shovelnose or red tail may not be community when they get bigger because they'll eat small fish. They have huge mouths and can swallow up smaller fish no problem. So if you buy a baby, be ready because it will become a big fish. The same holds true for tinfoil barbs. Most stores sell the small version but they also become very big and may

eat small fish. keep in mind that even the guppy or dalmation molly can become a bully. Any fish, no matter how community it is, can become aggressive.

It is somewhat rare but can happen. Aggressiveness is sometimes based on tank size. Community fish are more apt to quarrel with each other in a 5 gallon tank or a 10 gallon tank that is overcrowded. Put a bunch of semi aggressive fish in a 75 gallon tank and you may not see any aggression.

When it comes to aggressive fish, the fish farms recommend 1 oscar by itself. You may think that after several years of 2 or 3 oscars doing well together that you are safe. That may not be true. I have had quite a few people tell me that 2 oscars lived together for 5 years and one day they come home and one oscar is all beat up and dead. Aggressive fish are hard to predict. Things like devils, dempseys, convicts, parrots, and pacus may be fine for awhile and then

one decides he's the leader and the fighting starts. Again, if your tank is 125 gallons or more, you may be safe. If they all have a lot of room, the aggression is subdued.
