



CORTLAND COUNTY TRIVIA FROM THE CORTLAND COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

D ID YOU KNOW THE ANSWER to our question in the last issue of the CAT? Whom is Cortland County named after?

Cortland County was named after Pierre Van Cortlandt (1721-1814), the first lieutenant governor of New York. Van Cortlandt was born in New York City and was descended from Dutch settlers. King William III granted, by Royal Charter, an 86,000-acre tract of land along the Hudson River to Stephanus Van Cortlandt, grandfather of Pierre.

Pierre Van Cortlandt was an important asset to the Patriots during the Revolutionary War, serving in many capacities, including as a colonel, and later as a general, in the militia. He was a close friend of George Washington.

Pierre Van Cortlandt owned land in Cortland and other neighboring counties, and this was his direct connection to Cortland County. It is reported that he gave the bell which hung in the tower of the original courthouse, which was located on Courthouse Hill, overlooking the village of Cortland below.

CREATURE FEATURE TURKEY TIDBITS

Most people know a little about the Wild Turkey, including how the male bird is called a Tom or gobbler, and the female a hen. Other folks might even recall that the Wild Turkey was nearly hunted to extinction until restoration programs successfully reestablished it across North America. Today, let's explore a few lesser known facts about November's feathered icon.

Only male turkeys sport spurs and a beard -- but both genders have *wattles* (the fleshy red skin dangling under the chin) and *snoods* (an appendage hanging from the face). Studies have shown that the length of a Tom's snood is associated with health and can predict whether he will dominate a rival. Research also reveals that hens prefer Toms with longer snoods! During breeding season, Toms sometimes group up to woo hens, but only one male gets to mate.

In search of food and water, Wild Turkeys may wander several miles a day. Acorns are a favored food this time of year. When a turkey finds an acorn, it picks it up, stretches out its neck and swallows. The tough nut gets stored and softened in the bird's crop before passing on to the gizzard, where it is ground down by powerful muscles and tiny stones eaten to aid digestion.



JOSIE'S JOURNEY IS LOOKING FOR handler/dog team members. If you have a dog that is well-mannered, easy going around people and other dogs and you have an interest in volunteering your time supporting individuals and/or groups in our community, we would love to talk with you more about joining our team. Handler/dog teams are required to obtain the Canine Good Citizenship certification. Below are the CGC test items. If you feel you and your dog would be a good fit, we can be reached at <u>caringpawsforjosie@outlook.com</u> or 607 345-7660. We look forward to talking with you!

Canine Good Citizenship Test Items:

1. Accepting a friendly stranger: Evaluator approaches and pretends to shake hands with handler (hands 6-12" apart). Evaluator does not touch dog.

2. Sitting politely for petting: Evaluator pets dog; dog must show no shyness or resentment.

3. Appearance and grooming: Evaluator inspects dog, combs or brushes lightly, examines ears and each front foot.

4. Out for a walk: Handler takes dog for a short walk including right turn, left turn, about turn and stop.

5. Walking through a crowd: Dog and handler walk close to several people; dog may show causal interest but not jump up.

6. Sit and down on cue/Staying in place: Handler shows that dog can do both sit and down, then chooses a position, leaves dog and goes to the end of a 20 ft. line, and returns immediately

7. Coming when called: With dog still on 20 ft. line from Test 6, handler walks out 10 ft. and calls the dog.

8. Reaction to another dog: Two handlers and dogs approach, pretend to shake hands (hands 6-12" apart), exchange pleasantries, then move on.

9. Reaction to distractions: Distractions are presented; dog may not panic or show aggression.

10. Supervised separation: Handler goes out of sight for 3-min. Dog is held on a 6-ft. leash by an evaluator.

Clothing will be accepted at each location for a five-week collection period, ending on November 20. The donations will be picked up by Finger Lakes ReUse, sorted by Rotary volunteers, and readied for distribution through the Samaritan Center of Catholic Charities. Distribution will take place November 8 – 19, Monday – Friday, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

All winter clothing in good repair is accepted. There is a special need for children's outerwear, including sweaters, coats, snow pants, boots, hats, scarves, and gloves/mittens, as well as blankets. Adult warm clothing is needed as well. Each article of clothing donated should be clean, new or gently used.






